MEMORANDUM

RE: Recommendations for 2021 Public Art

The 2021 Work Plan Subcommittee met on April 8, 2021, and developed the following recommendations to move forward art and culture projects in 2021. In making the recommendations, the committee utilized the goals established Art Placement Plan, and the financial resources available for art.

In Year 1, from the Placement Plan, the theme is *Indigenous peoples and lands*. The small scale art is recommended to focus on storm water infrastructure (for example, creating art on manholes, catch basins, and other storm water treatment infrastructure). The large scale recommendation is to create one to two gateway sculptures near the city limits of Grand Rapids.

Funding Available

The Arts and Culture Capital Projects Fund is solely created and funded through street reconstruction projects. By resolution, the City Council elected to place 1.5% of construction cost when streets are reconstructed in the Arts and Culture Capital Projects Fund.

Once the Dewey Goodwin large sculpture if completed this year, it is estimated that the Arts and Culture Capital Fund will have a deficit of approximately \$1,995. Due to budget restrictions and limited spending on street projects for the next three years, the Arts and Culture Commission will have limited financial resources for public art. The following table estimates the annual capital funding.



Recognizing the limited financial resources, it is recommended that the commission seek outside funding like the IRRR Street Scape program or partner with the Public Works Department on Storm Water Education.

Small Scale Artwork

In 2019, the commission solicited RFP's for decorative crosswalks and storm sewer catch basin art. The commission did not receive any proposals from artists so they transferred the budget to the large sculpture being created by Dewey Goodwin.

With the focus on storm water infrastructure there is a perfect opportunity to partner with the Public Works department on interim improvements to 2nd Street NE, 1st Avenue NE, and the public parking lot located to the north and west of said streets. Due to timing and City budget constraints, the parking lot improvement (shown below) has been delayed for likely two to four years.



Delaying the permanent improvements creates an opportunity to install temporary art on the pavement by creating artistic crosswalks, delineating future "bump outs" with pavement art, and providing art on catch basins and manhole covers. This type of art is the recommendation identified in Year 1 of the Placement Plan with a budget of \$5,000.

Some examples of pavement and catch basin/manhole painting are:







The subcommittee is recommending the following:

- 1. Work with local artists to create artistic templates that can be utilized by children to paint storm water catch basins. This would be similar to a paint by color concepts.
- 2. Work with local artists to create cross walk art concepts and invite the public to assist in painting the cross walks.
- 3. By creating decorative crosswalks and storm sewer catch basins the commission will be achieving small scale goals for Year 1 and 2 from the Public Art Implementation Plan.
