





Building Permit Valuation Year End Statistics














Building Permit-Valuation by Categor **Year End Statistics**


Yearly Building Permit Valuation by Category





Emergency Working Capital Loan Program (EWCL)

- On March 30th GREDA launched a new program to provide working capital loans to businesses impacted by the
- The first round of the EWCL program was funded with a \$500,000 Blandin Foundation loan to GREDA.
- The second round of the EWCL program, which was made available on August 20th, was funded with a \$200,000 IRRRB grant to GREDA and an additional \$150,000 loan from the Blandin Foundation.
- The EWCL provided zero interest loans of up to \$30,000/business. Payments on the loans are deferred for 6 months and amortized over a 5 year term.
- In all, GREDA provided 50 loans totaling \$880,000 to Grand Rapids businesses and nonprofit corporations following a social enterprise model.

Coronavirus Relief Fund Small Business Grant Program

- On August 20th GREDA launched a new small business grant program funded with \$411,000 of the City of Grand Rapids' Federal CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund allotment.
- The grants were offered as matching funds to EWCL recipients.
- The grant amounts were based upon a percentage of the EWCL amount. ranging between 50% of loans <=</p> \$15K and 75% of \$30K loans
- Grants were provided to a total of 30 businesses.

Commercial Building Improvement Loan Program (CBIL)

- The objective of the CBIL is to fill the financing gap between project costs and private debt financing and private equity by making direct, below market interest, loans to building owners and leaseholders improve the appearance and function of their buildings.
- Since the restructuring of the program in 2006 GREDA has provided \$844K loans to 26 projects.
- The CBIL program can provide up to \$40,000 per project. Loans are amortized over 20 years with a 5 year balloon. The interest rate has been lowered recently from 4% to 2% through the use of PRI funds from the Foundation.

Small Cities Development Program (SCDP)

- GREDA is in the final year of implementing the 3rd DEED Comprehensive SCDP grant awarded to the City in the last 10 years.
- \$665K of deferred/forgivable loans of up to \$32,000 to 23 commercial building rehabilitation projects In combination, these three SCDP grants have allowed GREDA to provide an additional in largeted areas of Grand Rapids.
- The current SCDP program has assisted in the rehabilitation of 8 commercial buildings and 16 owner-occupied single family homes.
- The term of the SCDP grant runs through September of 2021.



Redevelopment Loan Fund

- The Blandin Foundation has recently re-established a \$1,000,000 Program Related Investment (PRI) with GREDA for the Redevelopment Loan Fund.
- This fund allows timely access to short-term bridge and gap financing for commercial acquisitions and activities that lead the redevelopment of blighted/substandard/underutilized commercial property.
- The interest on each loan will be within a range of 0% to 0.25% over Prime, depending on project specifics and whether the loan is being made to GREDA or if GREDA is using the funds to make a loan to a private developer.

North Homes Expansion

- The City was successful in their application to IRRRB for a \$350K Development Infrastructure Grant to support North Homes in their planned establishment of a new 52 bed psychiatric rehabilitation treatment facility for youth and young adults. The project would convert and expand their existing facility at 1920 River Rd
- The North Home facility will be one of three in Minnesota and the only in the Northeast Region. This project involves approximately 45 new jobs with wages ranging from \$32,240 - \$75,000 annually, plus benefits.



GRPUC Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Improvements

- The City was awarded a \$300,000 IRRR Development Infrastructure grant that partially funds the purchase and installation of infrastructure that will oxygenate the industrial effluent coming to the WWTP from Blandin Paper Mill to eliminate odors.
- This project will lower the wastewater treatment costs passed on to the Mill by \$600,000 annually. This project will also reduce impacts to the Mississippi River from the current use of chemicals to treat odor.
- This infrastructure is in the final stages of construction and testing at two locations along the 2 mile effluent line between the Mill and the WWTP. The most notable location is along the River Rd. directly east of the former Hospital.

ICC Student Center

- ICC broke ground last spring for a new student center. The project involves the reconstruction of approximately 5,000 square feet of existing space in the library and media center as well as the construction of an additional 5,000 square feet near Davies Hall
- The City was awarded a \$175,000 IRRRB Commercial Redevelopment grant for demolition associated with this \$5,475,000 project.

Minnesota Diversified Industries (MDI) Expansion Project.

- The City was recently awarded a \$250,000 IRRRB grant which will support the addition of a new hollow core polypropylene extrusion line at the MDI facility in Grand Rapids.
- This project will expand MDI's market for their products and is expected to provide 60 new FTE positions at the Grand Rapids and Cohasset facilities over the next ten years.

GRPUC Solar Plus Energy Storage Project

- The City was recently awarded a \$230,000 IRRR Community Infrastructure grant that is partially funding the grading of Grand Rapids/Itasca County Airport property for the private construction of a 2.0MW solar array and a 2.5MWh energy storage infrastructure system.
- The developer and owner of the solar infrastructure will lease the land from the Airport and will enter into a long-term power purchase agreement with Minnesota Power, who provides energy to GRPUC.
- The energy storage infrastructure will allow the solar energy to be stored until it can be used at peak demand times, which is intended to lower demand charges that are passed onto the 7,000 GRPUC electrical customers.
- The solar equipment is one of the very few permitted uses of land in the runway safety zones.



That part of Sleeper Avenue (First Avenue NE), according to the plat of Grand Rapids First Division, on file and of record in the Office of the Itasca County Recorder, that lies southerly of the easterly extension of the north line of Lot 1, Block 29 of said plat, and northerly of a line defined between the Minnesota Department of Transportation monuments B2 and B3 as shown on the Minnesota Department of Transportation Right of Way Plat No. 31-131 on file and of record in the Office of the Itasca County Recorder:

AND,

That part of the north – south alley located within Block 29, according to the plat of Grand Rapids First Division, on file and of record in the Office of the Itasca County Recorder, that lies between Lots 4 through 21 inclusive.

Itasca County has acquired properties within Block 29, Grand Rapids First Division, with the exception of City Hall, for a planned expansion of the Itasca County Court House. Properties include: Grand Rapids Fire Hall, the former Northprint Building, Vanity Cleaners, and the former Judy Garland Museum building. For the westward expansion of the Court House to proceed, Itasca County has petitioned the vacation of the portion of 1st Avenue NE lying between the Fire Hall and Vanity Cleaners, as well as the majority of the N/S alley lying with Block 29 (between the Northprint Building and the Fire Hall parking area and former Judy Garland Museum building).



Background Information:

In November 2020, the PLUM Catalyst brought together a team for the scoping and writing of a MnDOT Connected and Automated Vehicle (CAV) RFP program on behalf of May Mobility, and the public/private team of stakeholders. Working with the IRRR, City of Grand Rapids, May Mobility, Via, and other local stakeholders, the final MnDOT CAV Challenge RFP submission (submitted on Feb 11, 2021) proposed a funding contribution of approximately 40% of the total project, an ask of about \$1.3M which included funding for: \$935k toward 18 months of shuttle operations and \$413k of University of Minnesota AV-related research.

The Grand Rapids team members, including Itasca Community College, IEDC and the City, expressed interest in also pursuing Economic & Workforce Development related project(s) associated with the proposed CAV shuttle project, which are ineligible for MNDOT funding. The objective of this work would be to examine the potential to attract future mobility technologies to the area and to create career pathways for jobs involving this emerging technology.

Given the current timing in the industry, including the supportive MN Governor's Advisory Council, Labor & Workforce Development sub-committee, and the available grant opportunities, The City of Grand Rapids and the economic and workforce development stakeholders would benefit from dedicated strategic planning and implementation time from The PLUM Catalyst to help champion the region with existing national/state efforts for these CAV-related industry needs.

The proposal from The Plum Catalyst assembles the full scope of the initiative in to four subprojects. Subproject 1 entitled "CAV Initiative Strategic Planning and Program Oversight" would address the objectives of: Promote and educate the local stakeholders regarding the new transportation and automation technologies, Identify and support outreach for program partnerships, Create objectives, timelines, clear goals and subproject alignment for full project funding partners, Work with existing local team members and other partners to convene kick-offs and check in meetings, Keep the program & subprojects moving forward.

The services proposed by The Plum Catalyst in the other subprojects, it is anticipated would be funded by other partners. In the case of Subproject 3, the IASC Board has approved funding already.

The attached proposal authorizes work by The Plum Catalyst for Subproject 1, cancelable with 30 day notice, at a fee of \$2,500/month.



PROJECT BACKGROUND

In November 2020, the PLUM Catalyst brought together a team for the scoping and writing of a MnDOT Connected and Automated Vehicle (CAV) RFP program on behalf of May Mobility, and the public/private team of stakeholders. Working with the IRRR, City of Grand Rapids, May Mobility, Via, and other local stakeholders, the final MnDOT CAV Challenge RFP submission (submitted on Feb 11, 2021) proposed a funding contribution of approximately 40% of the total project, an ask of about \$1.3M which included funding for: \$935k toward 18 mos of shuttle operations and \$413k of University of Minnesota AV-related research. The Grand Rapids team members expressed interest in also pursuing Economic & Workforce Development related project(s) associated with the proposed CAV shuttle project. MnDOT funding could not be allocated for workforce development related efforts so this effort was saved for future scoping. Additionally, since the writing of the MNDOT proposal, new Dept of Energy (DOE) grants relating to Vehicle Technologies and "living lab" funding have been posted. The group will continue to evaluate these new federal and other related grant opportunities to continue to expand the CAV initiative in geography and timeline.

In addition to program management with the tech clients like May Mobility, The PLUM Catalyst also serves on the Minnesota Governor's Advisory Council, CAV Innovation Alliance's Labor & Workforce sub-committee and helps other public and private clients understand and prepare for future labor and workforce needs. Expanding the state's current CAV-related efforts into greater MN is always a topic of conversation.

Given the current timing in the industry, including the supportive MN Governor's Advisory Council, Labor & Workforce Development sub-committee, and the available grant opportunities, The City of Grand Rapids and the Grand Iron Range CAV initiative economic and workforce development stakeholders would benefit from dedicated strategic planning and implementation time from The PLUM Catalyst to help champion the region with existing national/state efforts for these CAV-related industry needs.

PROJECT APPROACH

The subproject 1 as proposed will be contracted between The PLUM Catalyst and the City of Grand Rapids and additional efforts will be broken out into additional *Subproject* areas to align to funding partner objectives, goals, and deliverables. Examples of subprojects include:

Subproject 1: \$30,000 total or \$2500/month

Additional time - If additional time above the selected outlined subproject options is warranted and agreed upon in writing by both of us, those hours will be billed at \$270 per hour at the end of the monthly cycle in which they were accrued.

Travel expenses - The City of Grand Rapids agrees to pay reasonable and customary travel expenses for any business travel agreed upon in advance. Travel expenses include coach airfare, hotel accommodations, ground transportation, meals and related expenses. Use of my personal vehicle for travel shall be reimbursed at the IRS 2021 rate of \$0.56 per mile. Expenses will be billed monthly as they are actually accrued and are due on receipt of the invoice.

Payment terms - Our agreement shall begin upon receipt of the first monthly payment (an advance payment) and additional payments shall be paid monthly by bank transfer within 14 days of the receipt of an invoice and the monthly report. Additional time and travel expenses shall be included in the monthly invoice.

Duration - The term of this agreement shall be 12 months from receipt of the first payment. The term may be extended by our mutual agreement at any time.

Cancellation – Either of us has the right to cancel this agreement for any reason by providing a 30 day written notice to the other.

Best effort -Due to the nature of assignments and work to be carried out, specific results cannot always be guaranteed. We agree that I and The City of Grand Rapids employees will carry out work toward our joint objectives using our own best efforts and that immediate feedback is warranted if either of us feels the other is not utilizing their best effort.
