FAA requires an Independent Fee Evaluation (IFE) for engineering and planning contracts over \$100,000. Attached is a professional services agreement with HDR Engineering for evaluating the Construction Administration contract in the amount of \$3,000.00. Funding for this is 90% FAA, 5% State, 5% Local. Within this local share is a 50/50 split with the County. The City's total share of this contract is \$75.00.

WHEREAS, OWNER desires to engage ENGINEER to provide professional engineering, consulting and related services ("Services") in connection with the Project; and

WHEREAS, ENGINEER desires to render these Services as described in SECTION I, Scope of Services.

NOW, THEREFORE, OWNER and ENGINEER in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, agree as follows:

SECTION I. SCOPE OF SERVICES

ENGINEER will provide Services for the Project, which consist of the Scope of Services as outlined on the attached Exhibit A

SECTION II. TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ENGINEERING SERVICES

The HDR Engineering, Inc. Terms and Conditions, which are attached hereto in Exhibit B, are incorporated into this Agreement by this reference as if fully set forth herein.

SECTION III. RESPONSIBILITIES OF OWNER

The OWNER shall provide the information set forth in paragraph 6 of the attached "HDR Engineering, Inc. Terms and Conditions for Professional Services."

SECTION IV. COMPENSATION

Compensation for ENGINEER'S services under this Agreement shall be on the basis of

Additionally, OWNER recognizes and agrees that OT Systems are subject to internal and external breach, compromise, and similar incidents. WHEREAS, City wishes to create a visible and creative project to engender visible improvements and encourage citizen engagement within the City of Grand Rapids; and

WHEREAS, City has selected a group of two artists ("Artists") to participate in Phase 2 of the project;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exchange for the promises and other consideration set forth below, the parties agree as follows:



























ARTWORK DESIGN AGREEMENT

With sincere and avid interest, the collaborative team 2OX Studio LLC (Jim Sannerud and Greg Mueller) submits the following preliminary qualifications for the *Indigenous Peoples and Land themed sculpture*. As a collaborative North Shore sculpture collaborative, this is a unique opportunity to channel our curiosity into a meaningful contribution to Grand Rapids. In studying the RFQ vision, and reflecting on our studio mission and passion for meaningful community-oriented sculpture, we would be excited to engage people in creative and highly visible work at the Mississippi River's edge of 1st and Pokegama.

In response to the previous generation experience of Native American themed work, we worked with the Dakota Community on the Dakota 38 sculpture memorial in Mankato, Minnesota's Reconciliation Park. This work was a collaboration between Dakota artists, Greg Mueller, and IS Group Landscape Architects. The work was installed in 2012, the 150th year since the mass execution of 38 Dakota in 1862. This summer we will begin working with the Sisseton - Lake Traverse Dakota Reservation on a new South Dakota Department of Transportation "roundabout" sculpture. The project theme will include symbolic values of the Sisitonwan (Dwellers of the Fish Ground), Wahpetonwan (Dwellers Among the Leaves.) This coming year will also include partnering with the George Morrison family on implementing one of his totemic sculpture designs into the new Highway 61 Public Art Plan for downtown Grand Marais. The late Morrison was a long-time resident of the Grand Portage Ojibway Community and significant player in the abstract expressionist movement of the 1960s. Finally, I had the opportunity to become a recent student of Grand Rapids as a chosen Finalist Phase Artist for the Water Sculpture Project in 2019. This opportunity deepened my awareness of Grand Rapid's reverence for its natural environment and Indigenous history and culture. Some of that data homework could inform the direction of this project.

If selected as a Finalist Team, our studio would explore unique Indigenous attributes that convey of the value of water and the tradition of crafted utilitarian objects. A site research visit and meeting with local partners would be an imperative first step in design development.

Public sculpture should work. It has a job to do. Our intention is to synchronize a thoughtful design with the symbolism of a curious, Grand Rapids public. We appreciate the Public Art Committee's consideration of our RFQ materials.

Please accept this public comment on the above-referenced matter. As a representative of the City of Grand Rapids, presently authorized by law to regulate Gorham's Inc. dba Northwest Gas, we urge the Public Utilities Commission to confirm that Northwest is exempt from PUC ratemaking. Our community has worked with Northwest with the specific goal of establishing a gas utility that would be regulated by the community it serves. Our collaboration with Northwest addressed an unmet need for natural gas service and assisted economic development in the area. Without this option we would have never been able to serve our residents with natural gas in a cost effective manner.

Throughout our 8 years of service with Northwest, we have enjoyed a strong and mutually beneficial working relationship. Natural gas, at reasonable prices, is important to the continued thriving of Grand Rapids and other municipalities like ours in rural Minnesota. We support the goals of the small gas exemption and we believe it should continue to apply to Northwest. Northwest serves less than 650 customers in our city and remains eligible for the small gas utility exemption provided for in Minnesota law. Our points are summarized as follows:

- Local regulation of Gorham's Inc dba Northwest Gas has worked well for 8 years.
- We are confident in our ability to regulate Gorham's Inc dba Northwest Gas and have enjoyed a good working relationship with them.
- Natural gas has provided our residents with a cost-effective and reliable energy source and has fostered economic development in our community.
- We do not support Public Utilities Commission rate regulation and are worried it will negatively affect our gas service and the cost of such service and the ability to expand the existing system in a cost effective manner.
- We ask that the Public Utilities Commission confirm that Gorham's Inc dba Northwest Gas is an exempt small gas utility.

In short, we, the City Council of Grand Rapids, urge the PUC to confirm Gorham's Inc. dba Northwest Gas' exemption under the small gas utility exemption.
