Discussion Items

1. Discuss CP 2014-2, 2019 Street Improvements Project

Mr. Wegwerth reviews original bidding that came in significantly higher than planned and the decision to table the project at that time. The project was re-evaluated and recommendations are made to delay a portion of the original project, complete work on 2nd Avenue NE, 7th and 9th Street NE with the addition of sidewalk from 10th to 11th Street NE. Alley work has already been completed as a local project. As this still falls within the required time frame, there is no need to hold another public hearing. If Council approves moving forward, affected residents will receive a letter with the updated plans.

2. Climate Vulnerability Assessment and Adaptation Framework

Mr. Tim Scherkenbach presented information regarding climate changes in the United States, noting that Minnesota is one of the most vulnerable states, particularly in the northern areas of the state. He is recommending the Council consider preparing a draft vulnerability assessment. As to the question of cost, Mr. Wegwerth states that this would be done in house by City staff, working directly with the environmental group, therefore there would not be any direct cost with the exception of staff time. Consensus is for staff to move forward and return to Council if funding becomes a necessity.

3. Review 5:00 PM Regular Meeting

Upon review, item #11a, adopting a resolution accepting a matching grant for the Fire

Department, is added to consent and item #3 is moved from Consent to the Regular agenda as item #13a. Councilor Christy noted that Advanced Civics students at Grand Rapids High School wrote letters to the City Council on the topic of vaping. Letters are divided between Council members for review and response.

Background Information:

Under the July 1, 2019 new tariff, the IRA Civic Center would have seen an increase of approxiamtely \$9,000 annually in natural gas billing. A new firm transportation rate was made available as of Nov. 1, 2019, which is the rate we'll pay according to this agreement. Transferring to the proposed firm rate classification also aligns our facility with 'firm natural gas' and we will no longer receive curtailment notifications.

Staff Recommendation:

City staff recommends entering into a Transportation Service Agreement with Minnesota Energy Resources for natural gas services at the IRA Civic Center.

Requested City Council Action

Make a motion to enter into a Transportation Service Agreement with Minnesota Energy Resources for natural gas services at the IRA Civic Center and authorize necessary signatures.



MINNESOTA ENERGY RESOURCES CORPORATION TRANSPORTATION SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Transportation Service Agreement ("Agreement") is made and effective by and between Minnesota Energy Resources Corporation ("MERC" or "Company") and IRA Civic Center ("Customer").

Whereas, Customer has obtained or will obtain supplies of natural gas and desires Company to receive such natural gas and transport and deliver such gas to Customer, and to provide certain other related services to Customer; and

Whereas, Company is willing to provide natural gas transportation and related services to Customer, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the covenants contained herein, Company and Customer agree as follows:

Availability and Description of Services. Service under this Agreement is available to an eligible Customer that: (1) is not receiving sales service under the Natural Gas Sales Service Agreement and (2) purchases its own gas supplies that can be transported by pipeline and then delivered to Customer on an interruptible or joint firm/interruptible basis by Company. Service will be provided on a firm basis contingent upon adequate system capacity only if Customer has arranged firm transportation for such gas supplies on the interstate pipeline serving Company's distribution system. Further, if a gas supplier arranges for firm transportation on behalf of the Customer, gas supplier and Customer shall sign a joint certification confirming said firm transportation of gas supply shall be executed and attached as Appendix B to this Agreement. The use of interruptible transportation service is only available if Customer has and will maintain both the proven capability and adequate fuel supplies to use alternate fuel if Company's service to such Customer is interrupted. At Company's request, Customer must reasonably demonstrate that it has such capability and fuel supplies and a Human Needs Customer must provide an affidavit that it will maintain both the proven capability and adequate fuel supplies. Customer represents that it meets the service availability requirements for transportation service under this Agreement.

Customer will receive services under this Agreement for the accounts and locations as provided in Appendix A. If Customer will have a gas supplier (a "Marketer") arrange for transportation on behalf of Customer, Marketer shall execute an Agent Verification Agreement.

2. <u>Service Conditions and Requirements.</u> Service hereunder is provided by Company pursuant to its Transportation Rate Schedule, Sheet Nos. 6.00 et seq. and pursuant to the General Rules, Regulations, Terms and Conditions, all as contained in Company's Gas Tariff



on file with the Minnesota Public Utilities Commission ("Commission"), as the same may be amended, modified or superseded from time to time (the "Tariff"). Customer is responsible for reimbursing Company for all on-site plant investments, including telemetry equipment, installed by Company to provide transportation service to Customer. Any such investment shall remain the property of Company. All Small Volume Transportation Customers must install telemetry equipment. Customer shall reimburse Company for the costs incurred by Company to install telemetry equipment or other related improvements. Any such equipment and improvements shall remain the property of Company.

3. <u>Applicable Tariffs.</u> Customer shall elect from the following tariffed services, as referenced from Company's Tariff and Rate Book, Section 6.0, subject to Company approval for the accounts listed in Appendix A.

Electric Generation Firm/Interruptible Class 1 Transport

Electric Generation Firm/Interruptible Class 2 Transport

<u>Optional Services:</u> The following services are available at Customer's option, subject to the conditions set forth in Section 6.0 of the Company's Tariffs:

Aggregation Service (applies to Marketer) End User Allocation Agreement

Customer shall, upon request of Company, execute such agreements as Company deems necessary or appropriate to effectuate the above services.

4. <u>Firm/Interruptible Service</u>. Customer elects, subject to the agreement of Company, the amount of Daily Firm Nomination as indicated by account, in Appendix A. Any usage above that amount shall be interruptible. To the extent that Customer has selected Daily Firm Nomination, Customer agrees to the following:



- a. Customer represents and warrants to Company that it, or its gas supply or both, will maintain, or will have and maintain at all relevant times, firm transportation rights on transporting pipelines upstream of Company's natural gas distribution system to deliver on a firm basis all volumes of gas to Company for Customer's accounts identified in Appendix A.
- b. In the event any such firm transportation rights are terminated or limited in any manner so that Customer and its gas supply are unable to deliver gas to Company's natural gas distribution system as provided above, then Customer or Customer's designated gas supplier shall immediately notify Company in email to the following address: MERC-Transportation-Team@minnesotaenergyresources.com
- c. Customer and its gas supplier shall jointly and severally indemnify and hold Company harmless from all suits, actions, claims, debts, liabilities, accounts, damages, costs, losses, penalties and expenses (including attorney's fees and court costs) arising out of the failure of Customer and gas supplier to maintain, or cause to be maintained, the firm transportation rights described herein.
- 5. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall remain in effect for a primary term of ONE (1) years from the date service commences hereunder, and thereafter from year to year until canceled by either party on six (6) months prior written notice to the other party.
- 6. <u>Balancing.</u> Customer agrees that nominated volumes and actual receipt and delivery volumes must balance. Customer is responsible for: (a) providing nominations which accurately reflect Customer's expected consumption, and (b) balancing volumes consumed at the delivery points with deliveries to Company's system. Failure to fulfill these responsibilities will result in Customer incurring balancing and/or scheduling charges described in Company's Transportation Rate Schedule, which charges shall be in addition to any Company charges, and which charges shall change as the interstate pipeline changes its rates.
- 7. <u>Pipeline Charges; Capacity Assignment.</u> Any charges which Company incurs from a pipeline on behalf of Customer will be passed through to Customer. Such charges may include but are not limited to any other charges referenced this Agreement and Company's Tariffs, General Rules, Regulations, and Terms and Conditions of Service.
- 8. Nominations. If Customer desires volumes to flow on the first day of the month, Customer must directly advise Company's Gas Supply Services Division by 9:00 a.m. (Central Clock Time) five (5) working days prior to the end of the preceding month of the volumes to be delivered on Customer's behalf.



For intra month nomination changes, to be effective at 9:00 a.m. (Central Clock Time), Customer must directly advise Company's Gas Supply Services Division by 9:00 a.m. (Central Clock Time) on the day preceding the effective date of the nomination change. Intra-day nominations will be accepted by Company on a best efforts basis until 3:00 p.m. (Central Clock Time) on the day of gas flow if the nomination is confirmed by the interstate pipeline.

- 9. Penalty for Unauthorized Takes When Service is Interrupted or Curtailed. If Customer fails to curtail its use of gas hereunder when requested to do so by Company, Customer shall be billed at the transportation charge, plus the cost of gas Company secures for Customer, plus applicable charges and penalties per Company's Tariffs. Company may in addition disconnect Customer's supply of gas in the event of Customer's failure to curtail its use thereof when requested by Company to do so.
- 10. <u>Billing and Payment.</u> Bills shall be calculated in accordance with the applicable rate schedule each month and shall be payable monthly. Upon request, Company shall give Customer the approximate date on which Customer should receive its bill each month, and if a bill is not received or is lost, Company shall, upon request, issue a duplicate. Failure to receive a bill shall not relieve Customer from payment.

The bill shall be considered rendered to Customer when deposited in the U.S. Mail with postage prepaid. If delivery is by other than U.S. Mail, the bill shall be considered rendered when delivered to the last known address of the party responsible for payment. Bills become delinquent if not paid within seventeen (17) days after rendering of the bill. When Customer payments are made by mail, bills will be considered as having been paid on the date of mailing as shown by postmark.

Late payment penalties are assessed on the past due amount and shall not exceed one and one-half percent (1½%) per month of the past due amount. The penalty date shall be not less than seventeen (17) days after the rendering of the bill and shall be considered to have expired at office opening time of the next day after the date indicated on the bill. Mail payments are considered to have been paid on the date of the postmark. If the penalty date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, it will be extended to the next normal working day before the penalty is assessed.

Customer agrees to take transportation service at the amount of Daily Firm Nomination indicated in Appendix A for the period November 1 through October 31. Customer may not transfer to sales service or modified its Daily Firm Nomination until the next November 1st and must notify the Company in writing at least ninety days prior to the transfer or modify as applicable. Customer shall fill out a Notice of Intent to Switch Natural Gas Services form and submit it to the Company for a change to sales service or modification its Daily Firm Nomination. A



customer may only transfer to firm sales service or modify its Daily Firm Nomination if Company is able to arrange adequate additional firm gas entitlements to meet the needs imposed on its system by the customer, without jeopardizing system reliability or increasing costs for its other customers. If Customer faces unforeseen circumstances that were not known ninety days prior to November 1, Customer may request a waiver of the notice requirement to allow Customer to transfer service or modify Daily Firm Nomination. The Company has sole discretion to grant or deny such a request and may only grant such a request if the Company determines that (1) unforeseen circumstances prevented Customer from timely requesting to transfer or modify service, (2) adequate gas supply and interstate pipeline capacity is available to serve Customer, and (3) the waiver will not result in any detriment to existing system sales customers. If the Company waives the notice requirement, the Company may require the customer to pay an exit fee to recover the costs related to a switch to or from service under this rate schedule. This exit fee may include, but is not limited to, any above market gas commodity costs, any interstate pipeline transportation and/or storage costs, and any other demand costs.

13. Regulatory Commission Authority. The provisions of this Agreement are subject to Company's Tariffs, General Rules, Regulations, and Terms and Conditions of Service, all valid legislation with respect to the subject matter hereof and to all present and future orders, rules, and regulations of the Commission and any other regulatory authorities having jurisdiction over (i) the transportation of natural gas contemplated hereunder, or (ii) the construction and operation of any facilities required to deliver said natural gas. Customer agrees that Company shall have the right to unilaterally make and to file with any and all regulatory bodies exercising jurisdiction, now or in the future, changes in rates or new rates or any other changes to Company's Tariffs, General Rules, Regulations, and Terms and Conditions of Service and that Customer shall be bound by such changes or new rates as are approved by such regulatory bodies. - 14. <u>Acknowledgement of Transportation Risks.</u> Customer hereby acknowledges and accepts the following risks and requirements associated with transporting gas:
- a. the risk that Customer may incur penalties for usage of unauthorized volumes described in the Company's Tariffs and any charges Company incurs from the pipeline on behalf of Customer; and
- b. that Customer must stop using gas when notified by Company or by Customer's gas supplier of any interruption affecting Customer's gas supply or transportation service.
- 15. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement and Company's Tariffs constitute the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and supersedes and replaces all other prior or contemporaneous agreements between the parties regarding such subject matter.

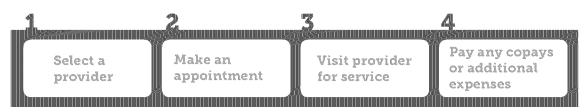

This amendment is by and between the State of Minnesota, through its Commissioner of Natural Resources ("State") and City of Grand Rapids ("Grantee").

Recitals

- 1. The State has a grant contract with the Grantee identified as LW27-01312 ("Original Grant Contract") for the development of a ballfield complex: four lighted softball fields, two soccer fields, playground, and 200 parking spaces.
- 2. This amendment #1 deletes 6.22 acres within the Land and Water Conservation Fund (LAWCON) 6(f) project boundary at the City of Grand Rapids' Sports Complex and adds 1.4 acres as replacement land at a new, unnamed park in the same city.

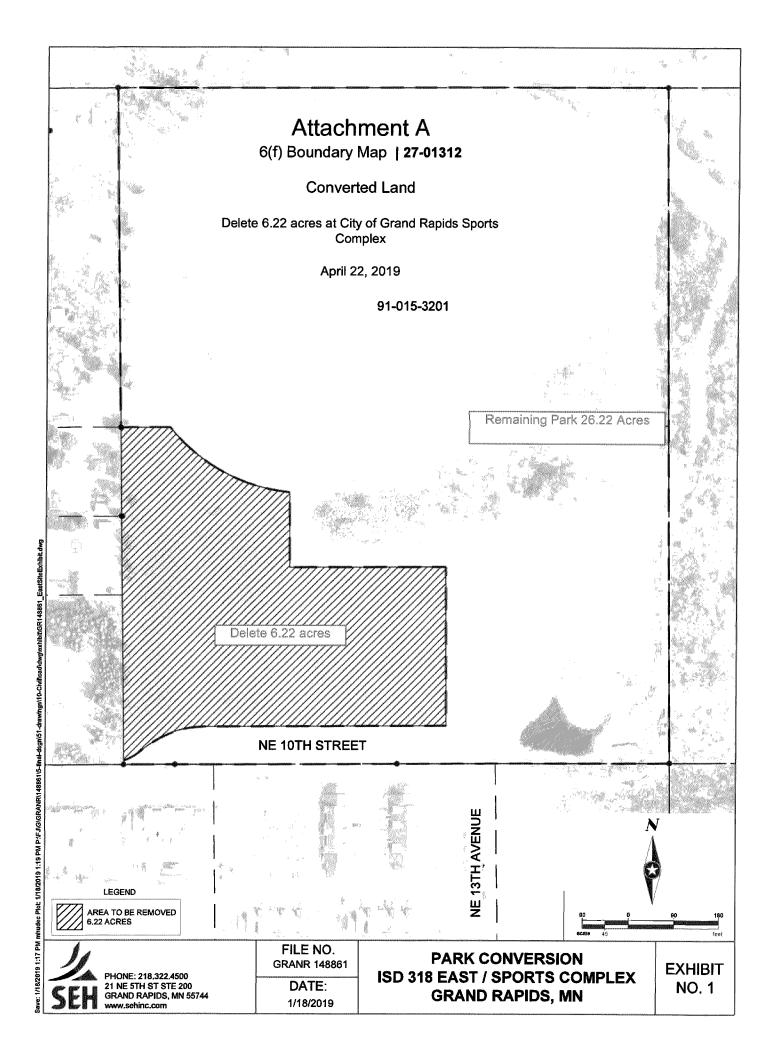

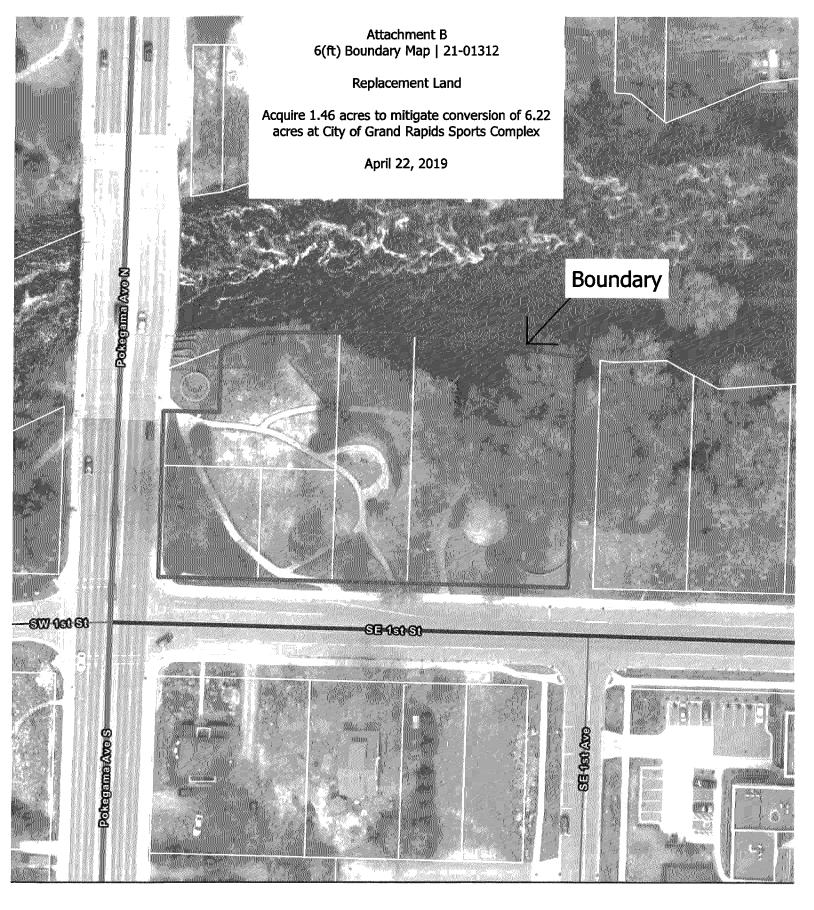

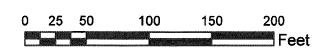

CALL OF ROLL: The following members were present: Commissioners Learmont, Schirber, Moren, Lopez-Cortes, Leming-Salisbury, Erickson, Turman, Ensley and Friesen. Absent: None.

SETTING AGENDA:

Motion by Learmont, second by Erickson to approve the agenda as presented. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

Presenter: Barb Sanderson shared information regarding a ceremony and plaque that recognized campus land at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, as the ancestral homeland of the Ho-Chuck people. Ms. Sanderson is proposing the Commission consider a similar plaque and ceremony for Grand Rapids, to be placed around the community at various locations for a time and then permanently placed at City Hall. The Commission appreciated the recommendation and noted that this could be possible focus for Indigenous People's Day in 2020. John Schirber states that in the future, he would like to see a bronze statue of a Native American placed in the community. Possibly at Blandin Foundation, a City park or Central School.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Upon review, members accept changes to July 31, 2019 minutes but reject the minutes from August 28, 2019 as needing several corrections.

CIRCLE OF HEALING UPDATE:

Commissioner Ensley stated that the next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, September 26, 2019 and an update will be provided at the October meeting.

BIG VIEW UPDATE:

Carlyle Brown event took place on September 10th and was well attended. Lots of historical content. Concluded with audience discussion. Commissioner Moren noted that this presentation was definitely intended for white audiences. Considered a successful event in that it stirred up discussion about race, as was intended. No follow up is scheduled at this time, but may be in the future.

OLD BUSINESS:

1) Indigenous People's Day Update:

Commission has headed up planning, organizing, marketing and funding for 2019 celebration. There is a flyer presented for distribution. MacRostie is hosting the event and Friends of Library will provide refreshments. Mayor Adams will present a Proclamation at the opening ceremony on October 14th. This event has evolved into a collaborative effort with many other organizations in the community.

2) "Colored Lines" Discussion:

Some of the commissioners have viewed the movie and state it is well done. As to the question of fund sponsorship, members would like a proposal submitted to include budget, schedule and plans for public showing events. Commissioner Lopez-Cortes will make contact and bring back more information at the next meeting.

3) Commissioner On-boarding & Training:

Commissioners Moren & Ensley will work on plans to develop an on-boarding process for new commission members. Minnesota Department of Human Rights has some good resources on the website. Will keep members updated.

4) 2020 Budget:

The proposed City budget includes a \$7,500 allocation for the Commission. The final budget and levy will be adopted by the City Council on December 16, 2019.

5) Work plan 2020:

Discussed plans for 2020, noting ideas for various activities, training, education and events. Commissioner Erickson will compile notes and provide to the Clerk for distribution to the members. Follow up at the October meeting to prioritize and develop quarterly action plan.

6) Interfaith Discussion:

Commissioners Friesen, Turman, Moren and Ensley formed a committee at the August meeting to do research regarding faith communities thoughts on Human Rights law and acceptance of all people, which came up specifically surrounding Muslim people. Commissioner Friesen made contact with Ben and Lisa Buchanan, leaders of Zion and Bethel Lutheran; both churches are members of ELCA. This religious organization is actively making statements that are inclusive and respecting all faiths and valuing people. Possible goals for this program included discovering how churches are reacting to Human Rights and getting the truth out, dispelling myths. Suggestion for organizing a petition sponsored by the Commission with a statement of respect for Islam or all faiths to be published in the newspaper. This would be presented to area churches, offering them the opportunity to sign on stating similar beliefs and that they stand with the Human Rights Commission. A panel discussion for the community could be held to provide information as well. The committee will meet and try to make plans for moving forward in 2020.

7) Security Issues:

Discussed at the last meeting the possibility of having law enforcement present at meetings. An officer looked in at the last meeting three times. Conference Room 2A is equipped with a panic button and meetings could be held there if members prefer. Staff advised that security cameras are monitored and building access is controlled during regular business hours. However, due to open meeting law, meetings held before or after regular hours require the doors left open/unlocked to allow the public access and isn't monitored by law enforcement staff.

Some members still have concerns for safety and would like to have the City consider assigning an officer to attend the meetings each month. Another suggestion is to work with Police Department regarding A.L.I.C.E. training. Commissioner Moren will follow up with Police Chief Johnson and Sergeant Andy Morgan.

NEW BUSINESS:

1) Consider sponsoring speaker Michael Lyons:

Michael Lyons is a speaker that was unable to commit to speak on October 14th at the Indigenous People's Day event, but will be available on Wednesday, October 16th. As this will be an extension of the Indigenous People's Day events, requesting that funds previously approved for the events on October 14th be authorized as use for October 16th to help sponsor speaking engagement with Mr. Lyons.

Motion by Friesen, second by Erickson to authorize previously committed funds for Indigenous People's Day to be extended to cover October 16th speaker, Michael Lyons, as a continuation of the event. Motion passed by unanimous vote.

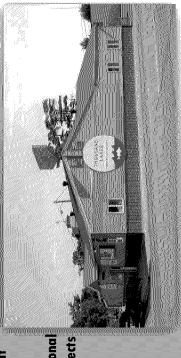
Economic Development Program Activity

Commercial Building Improvement Loan Program (CBIL)

- The objective of the CBIL is to fill the financing gap between project costs and private debt financing and private equity by making direct, below market interest, loans to building owners and leaseholders improve the appearance and function of their buildings.
- Since the restructuring of the program in 2006 GREDA has provided \$844K loans to 26 projects. GREDA has participated in 3 projects this year and currently averages \$110K/yr, in CBIL program loans.
- The Blandin Foundation has recently provided a \$500K Program Related Investment (PRI) to GREDA to ensure the CBIL remains capitalized. This allows GREDA to draw funds from the Foundation, as a loan, for use in providing CBIL program loans.
- The CBIL program can provide up to \$40,000 per project. Loans are amortized over 20 years with a 5 year balloon. The interest rate has been lowered recently from 4% to 7% through the use of PRI funds from the Foundation.

Small Cities Development Program (SCDP)

- GREDA is in the final year of implementing the 3rd DEED Comprehensive SCDP grant awarded to the City in the last 10 years.
- In combination, these three SCDP grants have allowed GREDA to provide an additional \$665K of deferred/forgivable loans to 23 commercial building rehabilitation projects in targeted areas of Grand Rapids.
- The current SCDP program has assisted in the rehabilitation of 8 commercial buildings and owner-occupied single family homes.
- The term of the SCDP grant runs through September of 2020.

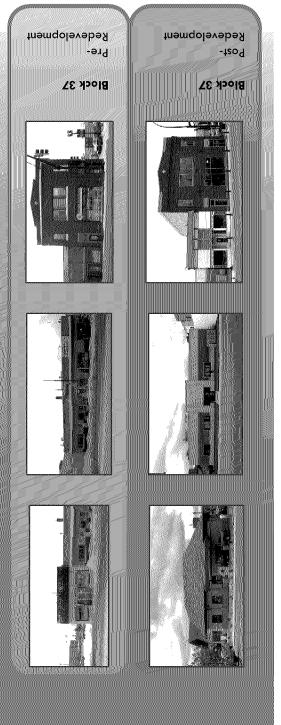




Economic Development Program Activit

Redevelopment Loan Fund

- The Blandin Foundation has recently re-established a \$1,000,000 Program Related Investment (PRI) with GREDA for the Redevelopment Loan Fund.
- This fund allows timely access to short-term bridge and gap financing for commercial acquisitions and activities that lead the redevelopment of blighted/substandard/underutilized commercial property.
- The interest on each loan will be within a range of 0% to 0.25% over Prime, depending on project specifics and whether the loan is being made to GREDA or if GREDA is using the funds to make a loan to a private developer.
- In the past, this fund was used to provided short-term funding for acquisition of property for the Block 37 Redevelopment





Redevelopment Project Activity

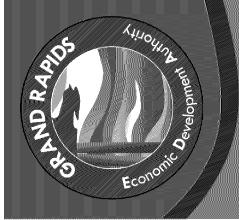
Former Sawmill Inn - Rebound Commercial Addition

- Approximately one year ago the City secured a \$100K IRRR grant for demolition and approved the use of Tax Increment Financing to offset the added site development costs (demolition) as well a portion of acquisition expense to acquire the existing building.
- Demolition was completed by the developer, Rebound Hospitality, in the spring.
- The subdivision (platting) of the property and design of the public infrastructure and site grading are near completion by Rebound's engineers. Construction of the grading and public infrastructure is expected to commence soon.
- The new subdivision (Rebound Commercial Addition) will extend 23th St. St from Hwy 169. The new street, sanitary sewer and water will serve 5 commercial lots, one of which will be the location of a new Best Western Plus hotel, scheduled to break ground in the spring.

Former K-Mart

- The owner of the former K-Mart, the Hartley Trust, made the decision to demolish the structure, allowing them now to market it as a site,
- The Hartley Trust sold the north 2 acres of the site, along the Golf Course Rd., which is now being developed for Anytime Fitness and Rapid Nutrition. The City secured a \$58,700 IRRR Development Site Infrastructure grant for that project.





Redevelopment Project Activity

Block 19 - Rapids Brewing

- The redevelopment of the former Righto Theater, former Township Hall and Body in Balance building in the development of Rapids Brewing is a significant enhancement to a key redevelopment site (Block 19), identified in the Downtown Redevelopment Master
- The City and GREDA supported this project by: selling the former Township Hall building, obtaining an IRRR Commercial Redevelopment (demolition) grant of \$96K, and by providing a CBIL program loan and SCDP loan to the development.

North Homes Expansion

In exchange for the 20 acre tract, the City received the former Riverview School site and the Forest Lake School, to be provided as a cleared site.
- The remaining property in Great River Acres was conveyed to GREDA who is marketing the 15 single family home sites and one 15-acre multi-family site for sale and development. Properties are listed on

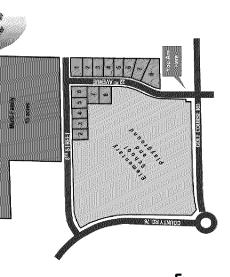

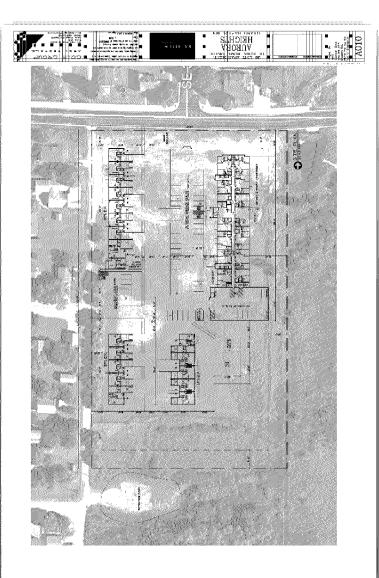

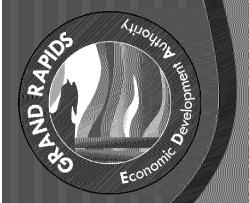




Former Riverview School Site - Aurora Heights

Background Information:

A preliminary plat entitled Rebound Commercial Addition was submitted by the planning firm: LJA (Lightowler-Johnson Associates) on behalf Rebound Hospitality (property owners Grand Rapids Sawmill Redevelopment LLC, and Big Ten Real Estate, LLC). The property included within the preliminary plat is approximately 10.46 acres in area, including proposed right-of-way, and is located on the former Sawmill Inn property (2301 S US HWY 169).

At the regular meeting, on May 2, 2019, the Planning Commission took up consideration of the preliminary plat of Rebound Commercial Addition, conducted a public hearing, and made a recommendation to the City Council for its approval, contingent upon addressing several recommendations (some of which were more design related) made by the staff review committee.

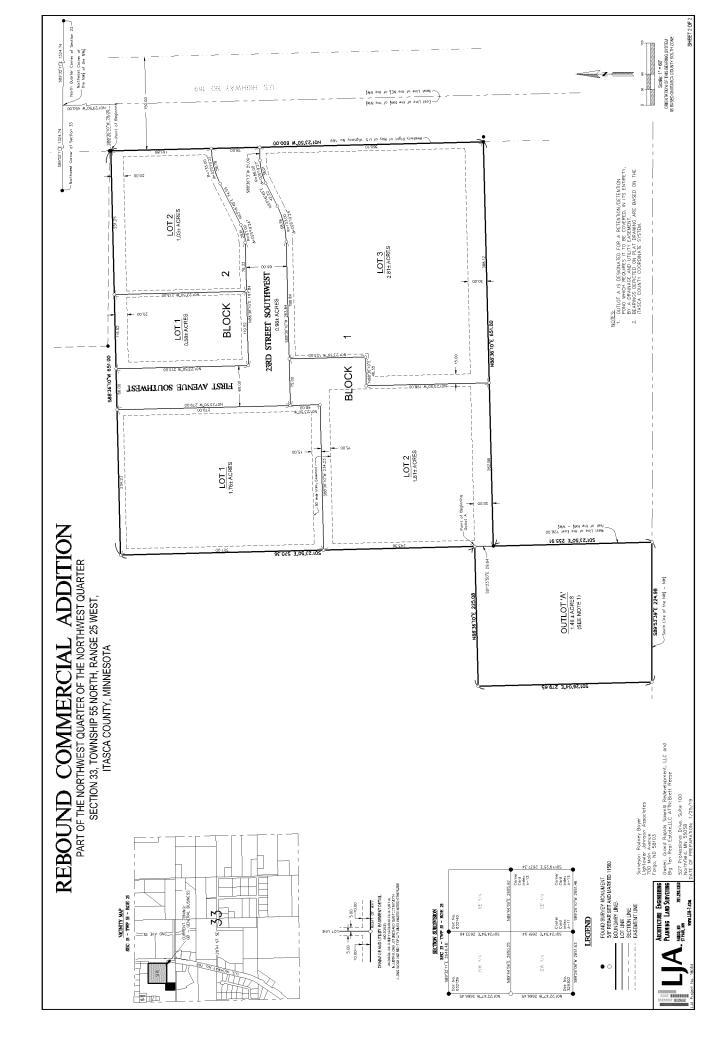

SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT

THIS SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is made and entered into as of _______, 2019, by and between Grand Rapids Sawmill Redevelopment, LLC, a Minnesota limited liability company, and Big Ten Real Estate, LLC, a Minnesota limited liability company (hereinafter referred to collectively as the "Subdivider") and the City of Grand Rapids, a Minnesota municipal corporation (the "City").

RECITALS

- A. Subdivider has submitted a preliminary Plat to subdivide certain real estate located within the corporate limits of the City; said preliminary Plat is entitled <u>Rebound Commercial Addition</u>. (Exhibit A)
- B. This City has, pursuant to its Subdivision Ordinance (the "Ordinance"), approved on a preliminary basis the Plat of <u>Rebound Commercial Addition</u> (the "Plat"). (Exhibit B)
- C. The City has determined that, should Subdivider comply with the terms of this Agreement, the language and intent of the Ordinance will be complied with and it would be appropriate for the City to approve a final version of the Plat, which then may be appropriately filed.

AGREEMENT

- 1. CONSIDERATION. This is a mutual Agreement, which the parties acknowledge is supported by adequate consideration, and which shall be legally binding upon the parties.
- 2. PARK LAND DEDICATION. In lieu of dedication of parkland within the Plat, the Subdivider, as is provided in the Ordinance, will make a cash payment to the City in the amount of \$10,786.50 (ten thousand seven hundred eighty-six dollars and 50/100) immediately upon execution of this agreement.

- 3. REQUIRED IMPROVEMENTS The Subdivider agrees to construct at the Subdivider's sole cost the following improvements within the Plat, and in conformity with all applicable standards, ordinances, and with the final construction plans for those improvements upon their review and approval by the City Engineering Department. The Plan A Required Improvements will involve the completion of: grading, aggregate base, street pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalk, sanitary sewer main, water main, storm water infrastructure, storm water retention pond (Outlot A), signing, street lighting, and turf establishment along:
 - (a) 23^{rd} Street SW a local section of street (from US Highway No. 169 to 1^{st} Avenue SW)
 - (b) 1^{st} Avenue SW a local section of street (from 23^{rd} Street SW to the north boundary of the Plat.
 - (c) 1st Avenue SW Cul-de-sac a turn-around, snow storage area, to be constructed beyond the north boundary of the Plat, within the Public Service and Infrastructure Easement (Exhibit E).
 - (d) Trunk Hwy. 169– a southbound right turn lane approaching 23rd St. SW, approved, designed and constructed to the standards of the Minnesota Department of Transportation.
- 4. SCHEDULE FOR REQUIRED IMPROVMENTS. The City and Subdivider agree that the Required Improvements, described in above paragraph, shall be substantially completed on or before November 1, 2020.

The above-described improvements shall be in compliance with all applicable statutes, codes, and ordinances and with the construction standards of the City at the Subdivider's expense.

It shall be the duty of the Subdivider to retain the services of an independent testing agency during the construction phase of the improvements listed above in Paragraphs 3 to conduct material and construction quality testing in accordance with the Schedule of Materials and Testing (Exhibit D). The Subdivider will forward a copy of the testing agencies reports, regarding the results of this testing, to the City.

It shall be the duty of the Subdivider to notify the City of the completion of the Work in writing and to thereby request a final inspection of the Work by employees of the City. A civil engineer, registered in the State of Minnesota and retained by the Subdivider, shall provide written certification to the City that the improvements have been completed in accordance with the approved plans and specifications.

The City, following inspection of the Required Improvements and the determination that the Required Improvements have been satisfactorily completed, shall give notice of the date of actual completion and acceptance to the Subdivider. Notice of deficiencies and of required

corrections shall be given to the Subdivider, who shall re-notify the City in writing when corrections have been made and may be inspected.

No Certificate of Occupancy shall be granted to any property nor shall any person occupy any property until:

- (a.) The Required Improvements are substantially completed in accordance with the terms set forth by this Agreement.
- (b.) The City has reviewed and accepted and the Subdivider has provided copies of all recorded covenants and other executed documents establishing the joint ownership and maintenance responsibilities of storm water pond infrastructure located on Outlot A of the Plat.
- 5. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE EASEMENT For the purpose of constructing a turnaround and snow storage area for the City's maintenance of 1st Avenue SW, the Subdivider shall execute and record, together with the Plat, a Public Service and Infrastructure Easement in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit E. A copy of the recorded easement shall be provided to the City.
- 6. CONSTRUCTION PLANS. Construction plans and specifications for the required improvements, conforming in all respects with the standards of the City Engineer and the ordinance of the city, shall be prepared at the Subdivider's expense by a professional engineer who is registered in the state, and the plans shall contain his or her seal. Such plans, together with the quantities of construction items, shall be submitted to the city engineer for his approval and for his estimate of the total cost of the required improvements; upon approval they shall become a part of this Agreement (Exhibit C). The original plans approved by the city engineer plus two prints, and electronic as-builts, shall be furnished to the city to be filed by the city engineer as a record in the engineering department.
- 7. FINANCIAL GUARANTEE: The Subdivider agrees to furnish the City with a financial guarantee in the form of a cash escrow; an irrevocable letter of credit provided by a Minnesota financial institution or other financial institution reasonably acceptable to the City; or in the form of other financial instruments which provide equivalent assurance to the City and which are approved by the City Director of Finance.

The Subdivider shall furnish the City with a financial guarantee in the amount of \$1,313,758.10 dollars, which constitutes 110 percent of the City Engineering Department's estimated cost of outstanding improvements as outlined in Paragraph 3 (which estimate is attached as Exhibit C hereto), and such financial guarantee shall continue in full force and effect until the City Council has approved and accepted all of the Work undertaken to be done, and shall thereby release the surety and/or Subdivider from any further liabilities; provided, however, that the City Council shall reduce the amount of the financial guarantee upon partial completion of the Work as follows: (a) upon completion of one-third (1/3) of the Work, as certified by the City Administrator in his/her reasonable discretion after consultation with the City Engineering Department and the Subdivider's general contractor, the financial guarantee shall be reduced by one-third of its original amount to \$875,838.73;

and (b) upon completion of two-thirds (2/3) of the Work, as certified by the City Administrator in her/her reasonable discretion after consultation with the City Engineering Department and the Subdivider's general contractor, the financial guarantee shall be reduced by an additional one-third of its original amount to \$437,919.36.

The financial guarantee shall be conditioned upon the full and faithful performance of all elements of this Agreement, and upon compliance with applicable statutes, codes, and ordinances of the City, and shall further be subject to the following provisions, which shall be deemed to be incorporated in such financial guarantee and made part thereof.

When any instrument such as an irrevocable letter of credit, submitted as a financial guarantee for the Work, contains provision for an expiration date, after which the instrument may not be drawn upon, notwithstanding the status of the Work, it is hereby agreed that the following special conditions shall apply:

The expiration date of all such instruments shall be no earlier than December 31st, of the year in which it is issued or the closest business day in the case of weekends and legal holidays.

The Subdivider (or in the case of a Letter of Credit, the bank or other issuer of the Letter of Credit) shall notify the City in writing, by certified mail, at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration date of the instrument, that (1) the instrument will not be renewed upon expiration; or (2) the instrument will be renewed and extended for at least six months beyond the initial expiration date.

In the case of the intention not to renew an instrument upon expiration, the Subdivider hereby agrees that an appropriate new instrument shall be submitted at least thirty (30) days prior to expiration of the initial instrument, to guarantee the completion of remaining work unless, prior to the expiration date, the City Council has found that all work has been completed and has, therefore, released the Subdivider from the obligation to provide a guarantee. If a new financial instrument is not timely submitted, and the City Council has not so released the Subdivider, the Subdivider shall be in a breach of this Agreement.

In the case of an intention to renew the instrument, the Subdivider hereby agrees that a written notice of extension from the financial institution providing the instrument shall be submitted to the City at least thirty (30) days prior to the expiration date in the initial instrument. The term of any extension shall be approved by the City.

- 8. SURVEY MONUMENTS. In accordance with Minnesota Statute §§505.02, Subdivision 1, the Subdivider shall set survey monuments of a permanent character in the locations on the boundary of the subdivision, and within it, as required within 1 year of the filing and recording of the Plat.
- 9. REMEDIES FOR BREACH. At any time after the completion date and any extension thereof, if any of the Work is deemed incomplete, or if a letter of credit or surety will expire

without renewal prior to completion, the City may proceed in any one or more of the following ways to enforce the undertakings herein set forth, and to collect any and all overhead expenses incurred by the City in connection therewith, including but not limited to engineering, legal, planning, and litigation expenses; but the enumeration of the remedies hereunder shall be in addition to other remedies available to the City.

- (a) Specific Performance. The City may in writing direct the surety or the Subdivider to cause the Work to be undertaken and completed within a specified reasonable time. If the surety and/or the Subdivider fail to cause the Work to be done and completed in a manner and time acceptable to the City, the City may proceed in an action for specific performance to require such work to be undertaken.
- (b) Completion by the City. The City, after 10 days notice to Subdivider, may enter the premises and proceed to have the Work done either by contract, by day labor, or by regular City forces, and neither the Subdivider nor the corporate surety may question the manner of doing such work or the letting of any such contacts for the doing of any such work, or the doing of such work. Upon completion of such work, the surety and/or the Subdivider shall promptly pay the City the full cost thereof as aforesaid.
- (c) Funds on Deposit. In the event that the financial guarantee is in the form of cash, certified check, irrevocable letter of credit, or other arrangement making the financial guarantee immediately accessible to the City, the City may immediately draw on a letter of credit, cash, a certified check, or demand payment by a surety. It may then deposit the financial guarantee in its general account. The City may then proceed to complete the Work, reimburse itself for the cost of completion as defined hereunder, and return the balance to the Subdivider.
- 10. AGREEMENT TO PAY ATTORNEY'S FEES AND EXPENSES. Whenever any default occurs and the City employs attorneys or incur other reasonable expenses in enforcement or performance of the obligations under this agreement, the Subdivider agrees on demand to pay the City the reasonable fees or expenses incurred by the City.
- 11. MISCELLANEOUS TERMS. This Agreement shall also be subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - (a) This Agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota.
 - (b) The terms of this Agreement shall not be amended, supplemented, or varied, except by written agreement signed by the parties.
 - (c) All terms of this Agreement which are binding upon Subdivider shall run with the land and shall be binding upon all heirs, successors, assigns,

mortgages, lien holders, trustees, receivers, or any other person or entity which shall succeed to any rights of Subdivider in the Real Estate.

(d) The Subdivider shall provide the City with copies of the recorded Subdivision Agreement, Plat, Covenants & other legal instruments pertaining to the Plat upon their filing with the County Recorder. No building permits will be issued by the City until this written verification has been provided.

Consider adopting a resolution designating City of Grand Rapids polling places for calendar year 2020.

Background Information:

Minnesota State Statute requires municipalities to designate polling places for each precinct by December 31st for the next calendar year.

In 2020, we will have four (4) polling places, two (2) of which are new. Precincts three (3) and four (4) will remain the same, however Precinct (1) will move to the Grand Rapids Area Library and Precinct two (2) will move to the IRA Civic Center Upper Level, sharing the space with Precinct three (3).

Staff Recommendation:

Adopt resolution designating polling places for 2020.

Requested City Council Action

Make a motion adopting a resolution designating polling places for the City of Grand Rapids for 2020.

Councilor introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

RESOLUTION NO. 19-

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE OFFICIAL POLLING PLACES FOR GRAND RAPIDS PRECINCTS ONE (1), TWO (2), THREE (3) AND FOUR (4)

WHEREAS, polling places are designated by the governing body of each municipality; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of a municipality making designations for polling places must designate, by ordinance or resolution, a polling place for every precinct by December 31st of each year for the next calendar year; and

WHEREAS, municipalities are required to designate polling places for each precinct, each year, regardless if there is an election scheduled for the next year or not, in the event a special election is called; and

WHEREAS, changes cannot be made less than 90 days before the next election, including school district elections or referenda, nor anytime between the state primary and general elections; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the City Council of the City of Grand Rapids, Itasca County, Minnesota, hereby establishes the following polling places within city limit precincts:
