The City of Grand Rapids operates the Domestic Animal Control Facility where stray domestic animals are temporarily housed. A portion of the intake process includes scanning the animal, normally a dog, for an embedded identification microchip. Our goal is to reunite the pet with its owner. We have two microchip scanners at the facility. They are at least nine years old and were received through a grant.

Recently, Community Service Officer Carl Fischer met with a local veterinarian who conducted the annual inspection of the facility. The veterinarian told Officer Fischer that our present scanners will not detect many of the chips in use today. Microchip identification technology has advanced beyond the capability of our scanners. The veterinarian recommended that new scanners be purchased which will detect all identification chips in use.

Officer Fischer researched the cost of new scanners and found that they are approximately \$400 each. In the process of doing so, he learned that there is a grant program to donate scanners to cities. The grant is offered by the AKC Reunite, Scanner Donation Program, 8051 Arco Corporate Drive, Suite 200, Raleigh, NC. If awarded this grant, there will be no cost to the City for replacement state of the art scanners.

Supp. 2001) and as outlined in the Minnesota State Retirement System's Trust and Plan Documents. All funds collected by the employer on behalf of the employee will be deposited into the employee's post employment health care savings plan account.

- 1. All full-time non-represented employees with two (2) years of service to fifteen (15) years of service will contribute \$50.00 per pay period;
- 2. All full-time non-represented employees with fifteen (15) or more years of service will contribute \$100.00 per pay period;
- 3 All full-time non-represented employees with two (2) years or more of service eligible for the severance payment outlined in the Flexible Time Off policy will contribute 100% of their severance to the HCSP; and
- 4 All full-time <u>exempt</u> employees with two (2) years of service or more that have accumulated over 248 hours of FTO on their hire date of each year will have those hours, up to a maximum of forty (40) hours, converted into cash and deposited into their post employment health care savings account. (The conversion is available only if the employee has used at least eighty (80) hours of FTO during the twelve (12) months preceding the hire date.)

- A. Host a minimum of one community conversation to gain input on what the final mural concept should contain;
- B. Host one public event where people can contribute by painting and tiling on the final design of the mural; and
- C. Participate in the public unveiling of the mural.
- 2. <u>Schedule.</u> The Artists shall complete and install the mural prior to September 21, 2019.
- 3. <u>Compensation.</u> The Artist shall be paid a Lump Sum fee of \$20,500 to complete the Scope of Work. Payment to Artist shall be as follows: \$10,500 upon execution of the Agreement and \$10,000 upon final completion of Scope of Work.
 - 4. Insurance. City waives any insurance requirements for Artist.
