The Arts & Culture Commission reviewed several responses to request for qualifications to create and install a series of three sculptures as part of the Public Art Project. Three artists/studios presented design and concepts on February 26, 2019. After careful deliberation, the Commission is recommending the Council execute an agreement with Milligan Studio for their sculpture series titled, "The Memory of Water." The agreements notes a total cost of \$30,000 to complete the scope of work as presented. Payment in the amount of \$22,000 will be made upon execution of the agreement and the final payment of \$8,000 at completion of sculpture installations.

WHEREAS, City wishes to create a visible and creative project to engender visible improvements and encourage citizen engagement within the City of Grand Rapids; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in exchange for the promises and other consideration set forth below, the parties agree as follows:

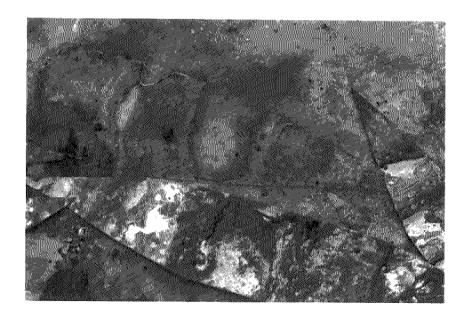

THE GRAND RAPIDS PROJECT:

The Memory of Water

The Memory of Water will return the "rapids" back to Grand Rapids. The triptych will be striking—boldly patinated in shades of blue, purple, and green. When viewed from above, these venound broaze waves will appear to be the color of water and yet when viewed from underneath they resemble the Northern Lights. Each of the three sculptures will build upon the narrative of the rapids growing in strength until it overtakes the viewer in an immensive experience in the final work.

Made of bronze, stainless steel, and local river rock, The Memory of Water will be fabricated using several classical techniques. The bronze

will be hand-worked in repaint technique to replicate the waves and oddies of moving water. (See enclosed At The Meny, Pg. 6) The stainless steel will be rolled to create accs that emulate the waveform.

The Memory of Water is a site-specific narrative work that will be both safe and welcoming for all as it is ADA compliant. Every 2.5 mm edge will be rounded. The bars are varied and spaced in such a way that will not invise climbing. Bronze and stainless steel are graffiti resistant materials proven to withstand Minnesona weather.

It is our hope that the work will inspire reverence for the power of water and an invitation to experience the environment.

TIMING:

Fabrication: March 15 to June 15 Installation: June 26-30. (It should take two days to install, weather permitting.)

MENTORSHIP & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT:

As our practice is rooted in community engagement and educational

residencies, we are very interested in meantaing early career sculptors. We can offer a private room w/bath and board at our Victorian home on Selby Avenue in St. Paul for sculptors who wish to assist on this project on a weekly (5 day) or weekend basis. During the process of installation, we would welcome local artists who wished to participate.

For Community Engagement, we propose a site-specific Remembrance Project, which can be installed at an appropriate public space such as a library or Town Hall. This is a temporary sculptural installation consisting of a hundred paper boats moored to pencils. These



boars are an invitation for community members to explore what they want to remember or be remembered for. In late June, thring the installation of The Memory of Water, the collected memory fragments gathered from the boars could be used to inspire poems created in a community writing workshop lead by Dr. Milligan, who writes under the name of N.M.Kelby. (nmkelby.com).

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

LIGHTON

Most communicies have a separate budget for lighting, and so we did not include that cost in our proposal. However, we do have a Minnesona-based commercial solar company we work with. If you would like us to pursue a plan for lighting for The Memory of Water, we could do so. We've been designing an interior lighting system contained within the rubes of the third larger piece, Ultramarinus, which will appear as if the sculpture is made of stars and be cost efficient, which we would offer as an option along with a more traditional lighting scheme.

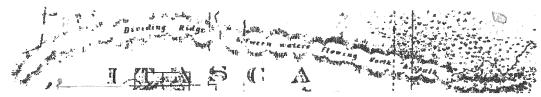
RIVER ROSE

It is our understanding via an email from City Administrator Torn Pagel that there is "A lot of natural round stone of many shapes and sizes" in the area. We're hoping that some of these rocks are easily procured for little or no cost once winter is over. We tried making

contact with appropriate local businesses, but they seemed to be seasonal. That said, we do have a Contingency Fund written into the budget to cover unforcesen costs such as this. The "boar" at Location 3 is envisioned as a series of rocks placed together in a boat shape to function as a bench.

Given the size of the sites, The Memory of Water would facilitate both communal and individual experiences. The work can be appreciated by those viewing in vehicle traffic or walking along the intersecting paths, as each of the individual works can be "read" from afar and yet have intimate details.

We are very thankful for having the opportunity to offer our proposal to you. The following are sketches of the proposed work.



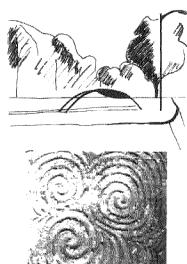

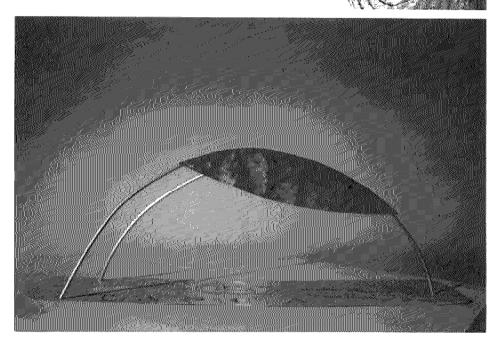

The pattern on the bronze wave is influenced by stone carvings of an eddy of water detail from Newgrange, on the River Boyne County Meath, Izeland. (Right)





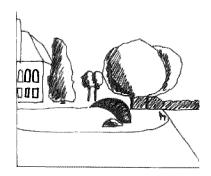

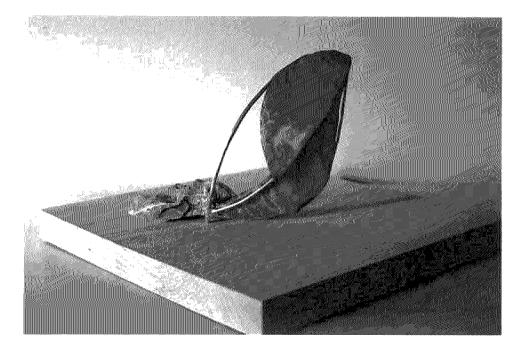

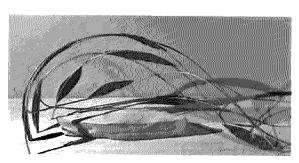

Some believe that there was a time when the sky and the sea were one. Ultramarians (Beyond the Sea), the final work in The Memory of Water, remembers that time.

The piece depicts the rapids as they once raged though the city. Its striking colors, open design, and sitting stones encourages viewers to engage with it. Inspired by the "naked eye" observatory of Astronomer Tycho Brahe, the work invites the public to stargaze celestial events, such as the Aurora Boocalis

With the help of local Atmospheric Scientist Bob Conzemius, we've positioned this final work to have the best visibility of the sites offered.

However, no matter what time of day, visitors can still experience the colors of the Northern Lights, as the underside of the waves have been patinated in those striking green, purple and blue tones.

BYLAWS OF THE HOUSING AND REDEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY OF GRAND RAPIDS, MINNESOTA

ARTICLE I - NAME AND AUTHORITY

Section 1. Name: The name of the Authority shall be the "Housing and Redevelopment Authority of Grand Rapids, Minnesota."

Section 2. Purpose: The Housing and Redevelopment Authority of Grand Rapids is organized to ensure that safe, decent, affordable housing conditions are available to the residents of the city. The HRA works to achieve excellence in the property we own and manage, and in the programs and services we provide.

Section 3. Office: The offices of the Authority shall be within the City of Grand Rapids, Minnesota. The Authority may hold its meetings at such other places as it may designate.

ARTICLE II - BOARD MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Membership: Five commissioners, all residents of the City of Grand Rapids, shall be appointed by the Grand Rapids City Council. Membership of the Authority shall consist of the Board of Directors. Pursuant to 24 CFR Part 964, one of the Members shall be a tenant of a GRHRA public housing unit located within the City of Grand Rapids, if such a tenant applies for the position and a position is open.

Section 2. Term of Appointment: Commissioners serve a five-year term and may be reappointed by the City Council. No commissioner shall serve more than (2) five-year terms, or more than terms totaling 10 years unless they had finished an un-expired term as defined in the following Section 3.

Section 3. Un-expired Terms: If any appointment becomes vacant prior to the five-year term, the City Council may seek applicants and appoint another citizen to the un-expired term. Commissioner terms by City Council appointment shall not exceed (10) total years of Board membership. However, if a Member begins a term by replacing a Member who had not completes his/her term, that period of time will not be counted against the maximum 10-year Membership service.

Section 4. Staggered Terms: At the time of these amended by-laws, there is a desire to have Membership terms staggered so that only one of the Member appointments expires per year. To accomplish staggered terms, the City Council may extend existing terms to accomplish this goal. Any extensions are not included in the maximum 10 year appointment.

ARTICLE III - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Board Role and Compensation: The board is responsible for the overall policy and direction of the Authority and delegates responsibility of the day-to-day operations to the staff. The board receives no compensation other than a monthly per diem that may be authorized at the annual meeting or expenses incurred during the course of board duties.

Section 2. Meetings and Notice: The regular meetings of the Authority shall be held on the third Wednesday of each month at 4:00 p.m. at its office, or another chosen facility of the Authority.

Section 3. Annual Meeting: The annual reorganizational meeting of the Authority shall take place just prior to the time and place of the regular January board meeting.

Section 4. Special Meetings: Special meetings of the Authority may be called by the Chairperson or two members of the Authority for the purpose of transacting any business designated in the call. Notice of special meetings requires two business days' notice for members, staff and the public.

Section 5. Quorum: A Majority of the sitting members shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting business transactions to take place and motions to pass. A smaller number of members may adjourn from time to time until a quorum is obtained. When a quorum is in attendance, action may be taken by the Authority.

Section 6. Manner of Voting: The voting on all questions coming before the Authority shall be by roll call, and the yeas and nays shall be entered into the minutes of such meeting. All resolutions shall be in writing and shall be made part of the journal of the proceedings of the Authority.

Section 7. Conflict of Interest Policy: The Authority will adopt a conflict of interest policy and all members of the board must sign this document on an annual basis. Copies of the signed documents will be on file with the Executive Director.

Section 8. Special Committees of the Board: Special committees may be appointed by the Chairperson of the board, with the concurrence of the members, for any special tasks as circumstances warrant. A special committee shall limit its activities to the accomplishment of the task for which it is appointed and shall have no power to act except such as is specifically conferred by action of the Board. Special committees must have at least one member of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers: The officers of the Authority shall be a Chairperson, a Vice-Chairperson and a Secretary/Treasurer.

Section 2. Chairperson: The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Authority; sign all contracts deeds and other instruments made by the Authority.

Section 3. Vice-Chairperson: The Vice-Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the absence or incapacity of the Chairperson.

Section 4. Secretary/Treasurer: The Secretary/Treasurer shall be responsible for keeping records of board actions, including overseeing the taking of minutes at all board meetings, sending out meeting announcements, distributing copies of minutes and the agenda to each board member, assuring that board records are maintained, and making financial information available to all board members.

Section 5. Election Procedures: Officers shall be elected at the annual reorganizational meeting of the board each January at which time a quorum must be present.

Section 6. Resignation, Termination and Absences: Resignation from the board must be in writing and received by the Chairperson or Secretary. A board member may be terminated from the board due to

excess absences, more than two from the board in a year. A board member may be removed for other reasons by a three-fourths vote of the remaining directors.

Section 7. Vacancies of Officers: Should the office of Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson or Secretary/Treasurer become vacant, the board shall elect a successor from its membership at the next regular meeting, and such election shall be for the unexpired term of said office.

ARTICLE V - EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND STAFF

Section 1. Executive Director: The Executive Director is hired by the board and the compensation of the Director shall be determined by the board. The Executive Director has day-to-day responsibilities for the Authority, including carrying out the Authority's goals and policies. The Executive Director shall be charged with the management of the housing projects of the Authority and will attend all board meetings, report on the progress of the organization, answer questions of the board members and carry out the duties described in the job description.

The board may designate other duties as necessary. As assistant to the Secretary, the Executive Director shall keep the records of the Authority, shall act as secretary of the meetings and record all votes and keep a record of the proceedings of the Authority. The Director shall maintain updated policy and personnel documents. The Executive Director shall hire and manage staff.

The Director shall have the care and custody of all funds of the Authority and shall deposit the same in the name of the Authority in such bank or banks as the Authority may select. The Executive Director shall sign all orders and checks for the payment of money, and shall pay and disburse such moneys under the direction of the Authority. Except as otherwise authorized by resolution of the Authority, all such order and checks shall be counter-signed by the Chairperson and Secretary/Treasurer. The Director shall keep regular books of accounts showing receipts and expenditures and shall render to the Authority at each regular board meeting an account of transactions and also of the financial condition of the Authority. The Executive Director shall give such bond for the faithful performance of his/her duties as the Authority may determine.

ARTICLE VI – AMENDMENTS

Section 1. Amendments to Bylaws: The bylaws of the Authority shall be amended with the approval of a quorum of Board Members at a regular or special meeting.

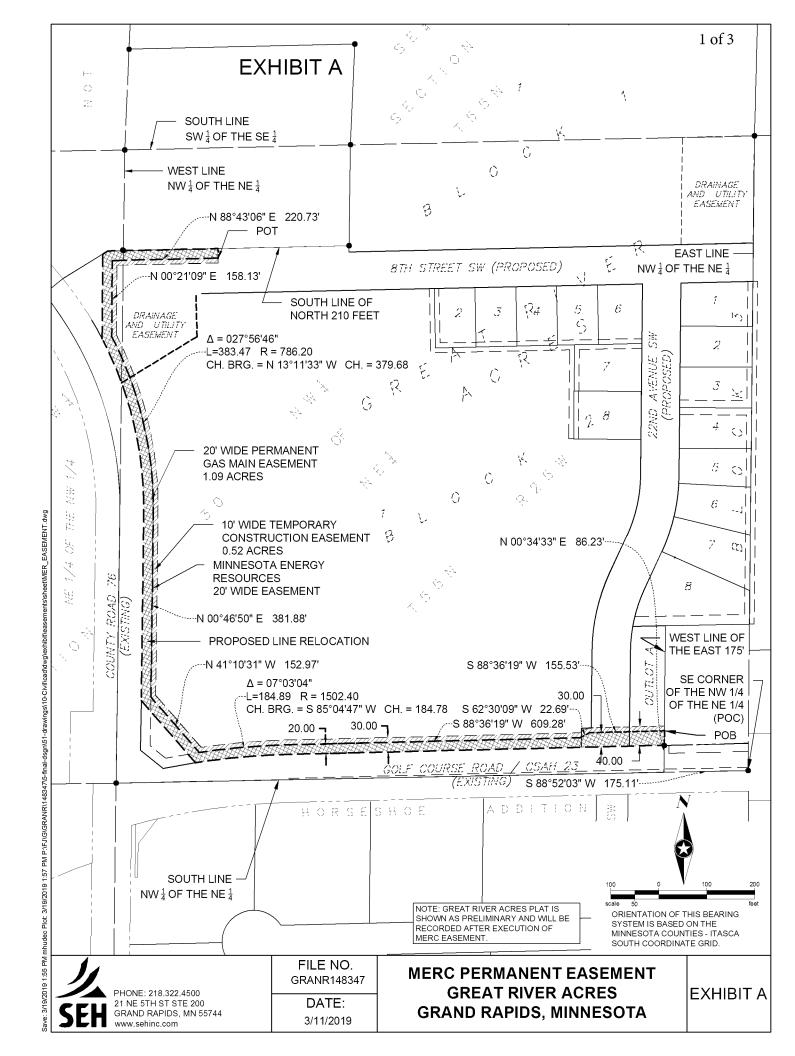

1. Easement Area: The Easement Area is described as a strip of land 20 feet in width (or such other widths as described hereinafter), being a part of the Grantor's land in a part of the Northwest ¼ of the Northeast ¼ (NW1/4 x NE1/4) of Section 30, Township 55 North, Range 25 West, City of Grand Rapids, Itasca County, Minnesota (the "Grantor Parcel").

The location of the Easement Area with respect to Grantor's Parcel is described on the attached Exhibit "A", and made a part hereof by this reference.

2. Purpose: This Easement gives, grants and conveys unto Grantee, its successors and assigns, subject to the limitations and reservations herein stated, the permanent and non-exclusive right, permission and authority to lay, install, construct, maintain, operate, inspect, alter, replace, protect, test, patrol, extend, repair, reconstruct, relocate, enlarge, and remove or abandon a pipeline or pipelines with valves, tie-overs, main laterals and service laterals, and other below and above-ground appurtenant facilities, including cathodic protection apparatus used for corrosion control, all of the foregoing hereinafter referred to as (the "Facilities"), all of which shall be and remain the property of Grantee, for the transmission and distribution of natural gas and all by-products thereof or any liquids, gases, or substances which can or may be transported or distributed through a pipeline or pipelines on, over, under, across, through and upon the Easement Area.

Grantee may designate or otherwise appoint, assign, contract, and duly authorize other persons, firms, or corporations to perform, carry out and complete, in whole or in part, the activities and operations herein enumerated, as it deems necessary and convenient for the full enjoyment and use of the rights herein granted.

3. Use and Access: Grantee shall have all other rights and benefits necessary or convenient for the full enjoyment and use of the rights herein granted, including but not limited to, the right to remove and to clear all structures and obstructions such as, but not limited to, rocks, trees, brush, limbs and fences which might interfere with the rights herein contained.

Grantor agrees that Grantee and its agents, contractors and employees shall have the free and full right to enter upon the Easement Area and adjacent portions of the Grantor' Parcel, as necessary or convenient for the full enjoyment and use of the rights herein granted, for the purposes of ingress and egress, performing survey work for civil, environmental,

- archaeological, cultural, and geotechnical reviews, including soil borings, wetland studies, and to perform other engineering studies and for other purposes consistent with this Easement.
- 4. Structures and Improvements: Grantor covenants and agrees that no structures or above ground improvements (as defined in the attached Exhibit "A"), obstructions or impediments, of whatever kind or nature will be constructed, placed, granted or allowed within the Easement Area. Grantor further covenants and agrees not to plant any trees or shrubs within the Easement Area.
 - Grantor agrees to comply with the Addendum General Construction Requirements and Restrictions for Minnesota Energy Resources Corporation Gas Easement Areas which is attached hereto, marked Exhibit "B", consisting of two pages, and made a part hereof by this reference.
- **5. Elevation:** Grantor covenants and agrees that the elevation of the existing ground surface of land within the Easement Area will not be altered by more than four (4) inches without the prior written consent of Grantee.
- **6. Temporary Easement:** Grantee and its agents shall have the further right to use, for initial construction purposes only, a strip(s) of land as shown on the attached Exhibit "A", as a temporary construction easement area. For non-wooded parcels Grantor and Grantee agree that Grantee may at the time of construction extend the temporary easement area up to an additional twenty-five (25) feet. The temporary easement is for initial construction purposes only and shall terminate when the need therefor passes.
- 7. Reserved Rights: Grantor, after the initial construction of the Facilities is completed, reserves the right to cultivate and use the ground surface within the Easement Area, provided that such use shall not, in Grantee's opinion, interfere with or obstruct Grantee in its exercise of the rights and privileges herein granted, or create any actual or potential hazard to the Facilities.
- 8. **Restoration:** Grantee agrees to restore or cause to have restored Grantor's Parcel, as nearly as is reasonably possible, to the condition existing prior to such entry by Grantee or its agents. This restoration, however, does not apply to any trees, bushes, branches, roots or other landscaping which may interfere with Grantee's use of the Easement Area.
- 9. Ownership: Grantor, its successors, assigns, heirs, executors and administrators covenant and agree to and with Grantee, its successors and assigns, that at the time of the execution and delivery of this Easement, they are well seized of good and marketable title to Grantor's Parcel above described, and that the same are free and clear from all encumbrances that might materially adversely affect the rights of Grantee hereunder, except the mortgages of record as of the date of this Easement.
- 10. Exercise of Rights. The Parties agree that the complete exercise of the rights herein conveyed may be gradual and not fully exercised for some time in the future, and that none of the rights herein granted shall be lost by non-use for any length of time.
- 11. Binding Effect: This Easement shall be a covenant running with the land and shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their heirs, legal representatives, executors, administrators, devisees, legatees, successors or assigns. The rights herein granted to Grantee may be assigned in whole or in part by Grantee at any time.
- **12. Non-Titled Spouse:** Any non-titled spouse signs below as Grantor for the purpose of releasing and waiving all rights he or she may hold under all applicable homestead exemption laws and all applicable marital property laws.

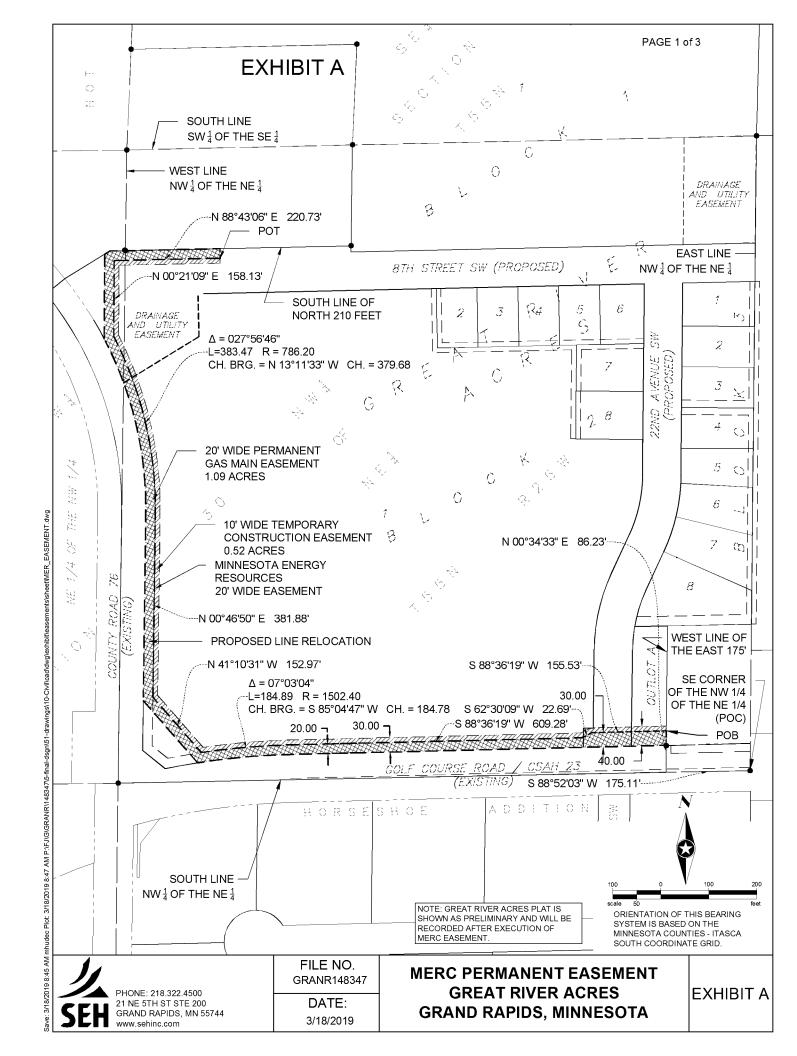
<u>General Construction Requirements and Restrictions</u> for Minnesota Energy Resources Corporation Gas Easement Areas

The Easement Area must be accessible to Grantee and its duly authorized agents, invitees, contractors, persons, firms or corporations.

- 1. Fill material, rubble, scrap, pavement, berms or earthworks may not be placed within the Easement Area without Grantee's prior written approval.
- 2. The elevation or grade over the gas pipeline may not be altered by more than 4 inches without Grantee's prior written approval. A minimum of 36 inches of cover over the gas pipeline must be maintained at all times.
- 3. Retention ponds and their inlets/outlets are not permitted within the Easement Area.
- 4. Drainage ditches or drain tiles are not permitted within the Easement Area without Grantee's prior written approval of Grantor's plans. Plans must include consideration for proper cover and erosion protection.
- 5. Septic fields or mound systems are not permitted within the Easement Area. Laterals to or from the field or mound may cross the gas pipeline, provided that they maintain an 18 inch separation from the gas pipeline. Any excavation within 2 feet of the pipeline must be done by hand-digging or vacuum excavation with a Minnesota Energy Resources Corp. representative present to view and inspect excavation activities.
- 6. Underground culverts, pipelines, cables, sewers or any utility may not be placed within 18 inches of the gas pipeline, and may not be placed within the Easement Area without Grantee's prior written approval of Grantor's plan. Any excavation within 2 feet of the pipeline must be done by hand-digging or vacuum excavation with a Minnesota Energy Resources Corp. representative present to view and inspect excavation activities.
- 7. Gopher State One Call must be contacted at least 3 days prior to any excavation or construction activities within the Easement Area. The current contact for Gopher State One Call is 811 or 800-252-1166 or www.gopherstateonecall.org.
- 8. Structures or above ground improvements are not permitted within the Easement Area. Prohibited structures include but are not limited to: houses, garages, outbuildings, storage sheds, decks, swimming pools, gazebos, satellite dish antennas and dog kennels/runs. Fencing may be permitted within the Easement Area with Grantee's prior written approval of Grantor's fence plan.
- 9. Planting of trees and bushes is not permitted within the Easement Area. Grantor agrees that any future removal of trees and or encroaching limbs due to Grantee's maintenance, repair, reconstruction and replacement of the existing pipeline from the Easement Area will not be compensable.
- 10. The installation of private or public roads may be permitted within the Easement Area with Grantee's prior written approval of Grantor's road plan. The road plan must show sound structural fill around the gas pipeline. Grantee may require soil borings to establish the subgrade load bearing characteristics of the site and prove that unstable soils are not present around the gas pipeline.
- 11. A paved/compacted surface, such as a driveway, may be permitted within the Easement Area with Grantee's prior written approval of Grantor's driveway plan. The driveway plan must provide a minimum cover of 48 inches over the gas pipeline.
- 12. Heavy earth moving equipment may not be routed over the gas pipeline without Grantee's prior written approval of Grantor's construction plan. The construction plan must provide sufficient load bearing protection, including, but not limited to, temporary pavement, heavy mats, additional compacted cover or other adequate bridging methods.

- 13. Minnesota Energy Resources Corp. Field Operations must be contacted at least three (3) working days prior to any excavation activity within the Easement Area to coordinate oversight or inspection, or to confirm compliance with these provisions. - 14. Additional protective requirements may be necessary upon review of Grantor's construction plans submitted to Grantee as required by the Easement.

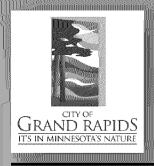

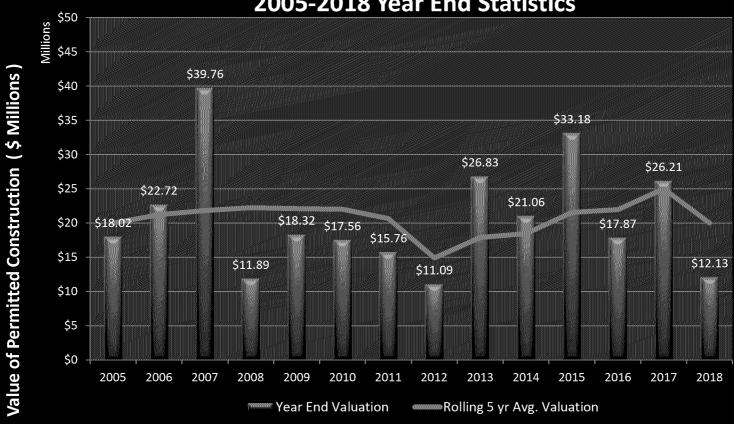

Building Permit Valuation Year End Statistics

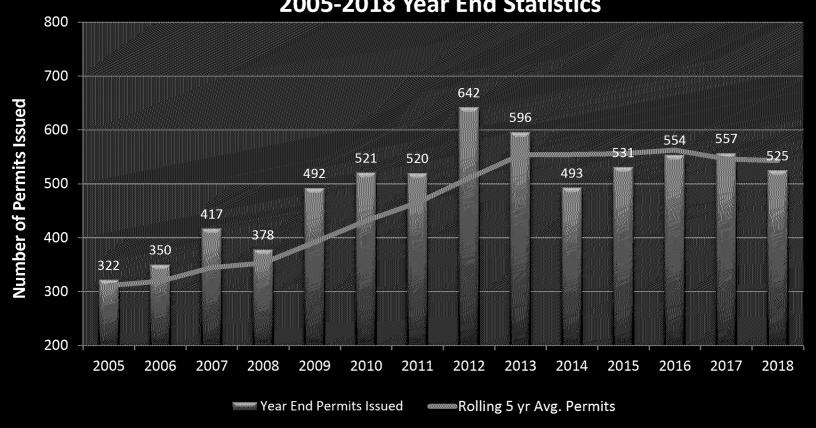






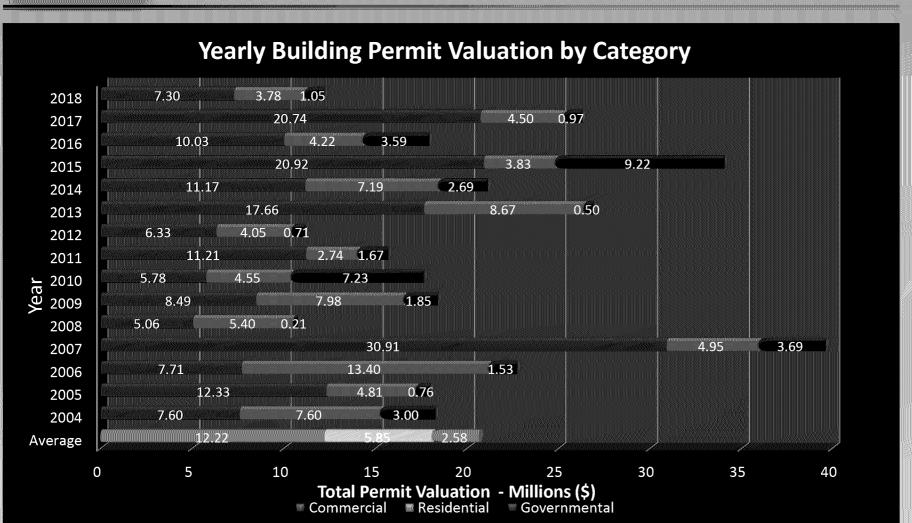

Background Information:

A preliminary plat entitled Great River Acres was submitted by Chris Larson, PLS - SEH on behalf of the City of Grand Rapids and filed with the City on February 6, 2019. The property included within the preliminary plat is 41.51 acres in area, including proposed right-of-way, and is located in the NE quadrant adjacent to the Co. Road 76 and Co. Road 23/Golf Course Road intersection. A complete legal description of the subject property is included within the preliminary plat documents.

The plat area is undeveloped and was previously owned by UPM Blandin Paper Company, and acquired by the City as part of a land exchange with UPM in 2016.

The proposed subdivision will be fully connected to the City water, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer system, and will generally be developed as follows:

- <u>Lot 1, Block 1</u>, 14.93 acre for future residential development (multi-family). Rezoning of property from existing SPU & SR-1 (Shoreland Public Use & One Family-Residential) zoning designations to a Multi-family Residential designation to take place in future.
- <u>Lot 1, Block 2</u>, 20.55 acre lot to be sold to ISD #318 for the future location of a new elementary school retaining the existing R-1 (One Family-Residential) zoning designation at this time.
 - o Elementary Secondary schools are permitted with additional restrictions in all residential zoning districts: 1-acre min. lot size, 30' min. yard setbacks, enhanced bufferyard planting schedule.
- <u>Lots 2 8, Block 2</u>, are intended to be developed as single family residential lots, retaining the existing SR-1 (Shoreland One-Family Residential) zoning designation.
- <u>Lots 1 8, Block 3</u>, are intended to be developed as single family residential lots, retaining the existing SR-1 (Shoreland One-Family Residential) zoning designation.
- Outlot A, retaining the existing R-1 (One-Family Residential) zoning designation. (Result of 22nd Avenue alignment and existing, privately owned property to east)
- 8th Street SW, will provide access to the plat from County Rd. 76 (west), and extend to the eastern boundary

of the plat.

• <u>22nd Avenue SW</u>, will provide access to the plat from Golf Course Rd./County Rd. 23 (south), and extend to 8th Street SW.

This spring/summer City Project 2019-1 includes the new construction of; public infrastructure (water & sanitary sewer) within the right of way of Golf Course Road from 22nd Avenue SW to the east 1,150 feet, 22nd Avenue SW, from Golf Course Road to the north 1,000 feet, 8th Street SW, from County Road 76 to the east 1,050 feet, within the Great River plat.

The 2011 Comprehensive Plan's general vision for land use in the area of this proposed subdivision is that of: a majority of Multi-family residential, Parks & Recreation near the Blandin Reservoir, and a small node of Neighborhood Mixed Use near the Co. Rd. 76/Golf Course Rd. intersection.

The staff review committee, consisting of the City Engineer, Public Works Director, Fire Chief, Grand Rapids PUC, Parks and Recreation Director, and Community Development Department, has reviewed the preliminary plat for technical standards and found that it substantially complies with the City's subdivision requirements. All departments were involved, and provided input, throughout the development of the preliminary plat.

Additionally, the preliminary plat was circulated to the County Highway Engineer, as the plat is accessed off of County Road 76 and County Road 23/Golf Course Road (*review comments attached*), and to the Commissioner of the MN DNR, as required by MN Shoreland Rules.

The Planning Commission conducted a public hearing to consider their recommendation to the City Council regarding the approval of this preliminary plat at their regular meeting on March 7, 2019. The Planning Commission found that the proposed subdivision was consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and approved a motion to recommend approval of the preliminary plat of Great River Acres, contingent upon the City keeping the Forest History Center up to date/involved with the trail relocation portion the City Project 2019-1.

(During the public hearing, the Forest History Center expressed concern regarding the lack of their inclusion in the relocation of a portion of the existing pedestrian/bike/ski trail, which extends from their property across what will be Lot 1, Block 1, Great River Acres, on to Grand Itasca's property and then out to Sylvan Point or 14th Avenue SW. *draft meeting minutes are attached)

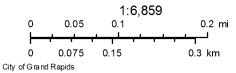

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EXCLUSIONS FROM COVERAGE

The following matters are expressly excluded from the coverage of this policy, and the Company will not pay loss or damage, costs, attorneys' fees, or expenses that arise by reason of:

- 1. (a) Any law, ordinance, permit, or governmental regulation (including those relating to building and zoning) restricting, regulating, prohibiting, or relating to
 - (i) the occupancy, use, or enjoyment of the Land;
 - (ii) the character, dimensions, or location of any improvement erected on the Land;
 - (iii) the subdivision of land; or
 - (iv) environmental protection;
 - or the effect of any violation of these laws, ordinances, or governmental regulations. This Exclusion 1(a) does not modify or limit the coverage provided under Covered Risk 5.
 - (b) Any governmental police power. This Exclusion 1(b) does not modify or limit the coverage provided under Covered Risk 6.
- Rights of eminent domain. This Exclusion does not modify or limit the coverage provided under Covered Risk 7 or 8.
- Defects, liens, encumbrances, adverse claims, or other matters
 - (a) created, suffered, assumed, or agreed to by the Insured Claimant;
 - (b) not Known to the Company, not recorded in the Public Records at Date of Policy, but Known to the Insured Claimant and not disclosed in writing to the Company by the Insured Claimant prior to the date the Insured Claimant became an Insured under this policy;
 - (c) resulting in no loss or damage to the Insured Claimant;
 - (d) attaching or created subsequent to Date of Policy (however, this does not modify or limit the coverage provided under Covered Risks 9 and 10); or
 - (e) resulting in loss or damage that would not have been sustained if the Insured Claimant had paid value for the Title.
- Any claim, by reason of the operation of federal bankruptcy, state insolvency, or similar creditors' rights laws, that the transaction vesting the Title as shown in Schedule A, is
 - (a) a fraudulent conveyance or fraudulent transfer; or
 - (b) a preferential transfer for any reason not stated in Covered Risk 9 of this policy.
- 5. Any lien on the Title for real estate taxes or assessments imposed by governmental authority and created or attaching between Date of Policy and the date of recording of the deed or other instrument of transfer in the Public Records that vests Title as shown in Schedule A.

CONDITIONS

1. DEFINITION OF TERMS

The following terms when used in this policy mean:

- (a) "Amount of Insurance": The amount stated in Schedule A, as may be increased or decreased by endorsement to this policy, increased by Section 8(b), or decreased by Sections 10 and 11 of these Conditions.
- "Date of Policy": The date designated as "Date of Policy" in Schedule A. "Entity": A corporation, partnership, trust, limited liability company, or
- other similar legal entity.
- "Insured": The Insured named in Schedule A.
 - (i) The term "Insured" also Includes
 - (A) successors to the Title of the Insured by operation of law as distinguished from purchase, including heirs, devisees, survivors, personal representatives, or next of kin;
 - (B) successors to an Insured by dissolution, merger, consolidation, distribution, or reorganization;
 - (C) successors to an Insured by its conversion to another kind of Entity;
 - (D) a grantee of an Insured under a deed delivered without payment of actual valuable consideration conveying the Title
 - (1) If the stock, shares, memberships, or other equity interests of the grantee are wholly-owned by the named Insured,
 - if the grantee wholly owns the named Insured,
 - (3) If the grantee is wholly-owned by an affiliated Entity of the named Insured, provided the affiliated Entity and the named Insured are both wholly-owned by the same person or Entity, or
 - if the grantee is a trustee or beneficiary of a trust created by a written instrument established by the Insured named in Schedule A for estate planning purposes.

- (II) With regard to (A), (B), (C), and (D) reserving, however, all rights and defenses as to any successor that the Company would have had against any predecessor Insured.
- (e) "Insured Claimant": An Insured claiming loss or damage.
- "Knowledge" or "Known": Actual knowledge, not constructive knowledge or notice that may be imputed to an Insured by reason of the Public Records or any other records that impart constructive notice of matters affecting the Title.
- "Land": The land described in Schedule A, and affixed improvements that by law constitute real property. The term "Land" does not include any property beyond the lines of the area described in Schedule A, nor any right, title, interest, estate, or easement in abutting streets, roads, avenues, alleys, lanes, ways, or waterways, but this does not modify or limit the extent that a right of access to and from the Land is insured by this policy.
- "Mortgage": Mortgage, deed of trust, trust deed, or other security instrument, including one evidenced by electronic means authorized by
- "Public Records": Records established under state statutes at Date of Policy for the purpose of imparting constructive notice of matters relating to real property to purchasers for value and without Knowledge. With respect to Covered Risk 5(d), "Public Records" shall also include environmental protection liens filed in the records of the clerk of the United States District Court for the district where the Land is located.
- "Title": The estate or interest described in Schedule A.
- "Unmarketable Title": Title affected by an alleged or apparent matter that would permit a prospective purchaser or lessee of the Title or lender on the Title to be released from the obligation to purchase, lease, or lend if there is a contractual condition requiring the delivery of marketable title.

CONTINUATION OF INSURANCE

The coverage of this policy shall continue in force as of Date of Policy in favor of an Insured, but only so long as the Insured retains an estate or interest in the Land, or holds an obligation secured by a purchase money Mortgage given by a purchaser from the Insured, or only so long as the Insured shall have liability by reason of warranties in any transfer or conveyance of the Title. This policy shall not continue in force in favor of any purchaser from the Insured of either (I) an estate or interest in the Land, or (ii) an obligation secured by a purchase money Mortgage given to the Insured.

NOTICE OF CLAIM TO BE GIVEN BY INSURED CLAIMANT

The Insured shall notify the Company promptly in writing (i) in case of any litigation as set forth in Section 5(a) of these Conditions, (ii) in case Knowledge shall come to an Insured hereunder of any claim of title or interest that is adverse to the Title, as insured, and that might cause loss or damage for which the Company may be hable by virtue of this policy, or (iii) if the Title, as insured, is rejected as Unmarketable Title. If the Company is prejudiced by the failure of the Insured Claimant to provide prompt notice, the Company's liability to the Insured Claimant under the policy shall be reduced to the extent of the prejudice.

PROOF OF LOSS

In the event the Company is unable to determine the amount of loss or damage, the Company may, at its option, require as a condition of payment that the Insured Claimant furnish a signed proof of loss. The proof of loss must describe the defect, lien, encumbrance, or other matter insured against by this policy that constitutes the basis of loss or damage and shall state, to the extent possible, the basis of calculating the amount of the loss or damage.

DEFENSE AND PROSECUTION OF ACTIONS

- (a) Upon written request by the Insured, and subject to the options contained in Section 7 of these Conditions, the Company, at its own cost and without unreasonable delay, shall provide for the defense of an Insured in litigation in which any third party asserts a claim covered by this policy adverse to the Insured. This obligation is limited to only those stated causes of action alleging matters insured against by this policy. The Company shall have the right to select counsel of its choice (subject to the right of the Insured to object for reasonable cause) to represent the Insured as to those stated causes of action. It shall not be liable for and will not pay the fees of any other counsel. The Company will not pay any fees, costs, or expenses incurred by the Insured in the defense of those causes of action that allege matters not insured against by this policy.
- (b) The Company shall have the right, in addition to the options contained in

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Section 7 of these Conditions, at its own cost, to institute and prosecute any action or proceeding or to do any other act that in its opinion may be necessary or desirable to establish the Title, as insured, or to prevent or reduce loss or damage to the Insured. The Company may take any appropriate action under the terms of this policy, whether or not it shall be liable to the Insured. The exercise of these rights shall not be an admission of liability or waiver of any provision of this policy. If the Company exercises its rights under this subsection, it must do so diligently.

(c) Whenever the Company brings an action or asserts a defense as required or permitted by this policy, the Company may pursue the litigation to a final determination by a court of competent jurisdiction, and it expressly reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to appeal any adverse judgment or order.

6. DUTY OF INSURED CLAIMANT TO COOPERATE

- (a) In all cases where this policy permits or requires the Company to prosecute or provide for the defense of any action or proceeding and any appeals, the Insured shall secure to the Company the right to so prosecute or provide defense in the action or proceeding, including the right to use, at its option, the name of the Insured for this purpose. Whenever requested by the Company, the Insured, at the Company's expense, shall give the Company all reasonable aid (i) in securing evidence, obtaining witnesses, prosecuting or defending the action or proceeding, or effecting settlement, and (ii) in any other lawful act that in the opinion of the Company may be necessary or desirable to establish the Title or any other matter as insured. If the Company is prejudiced by the failure of the Insured to furnish the required cooperation, the Company's obligations to the Insured under the policy shall terminate, including any liability or obligation to defend, prosecute, or continue any litigation, with regard to the matter or matters requiring such cooperation.
- (b) The Company may reasonably require the Insured Claimant to submit to examination under oath by any authorized representative of the Company and to produce for examination, inspection, and copying, at such reasonable times and places as may be designated by the authorized representative of the Company, all records, in whatever medium maintained, including books, ledgers, checks, memoranda. correspondence, reports, e-mails, disks, tapes, and videos whether bearing a date before or after Date of Policy, that reasonably pertain to the loss or damage. Further, if requested by any authorized representative of the Company, the Insured Claimant shall grant its permission, in writing, for any authorized representative of the Company to examine, inspect, and copy all of these records in the custody or control of a third party that reasonably pertain to the loss or damage. All information designated as confidential by the Insured Claimant provided to the Company pursuant to this Section shall not be disclosed to others unless, in the reasonable judgment of the Company, it is necessary in the administration of the claim. Failure of the Insured Claimant to submit for examination under oath, produce any reasonably requested information, or grant permission to secure reasonably necessary information from third parties as required in this subsection, unless prohibited by law or governmental regulation, shall terminate any liability of the Company under this policy as to that claim.

7. OPTIONS TO PAY OR OTHERWISE SETTLE CLAIMS; TERMINATION OF LIABILITY

In case of a claim under this policy, the Company shall have the following additional options:

(a) To Pay or Tender Payment of the Amount of Insurance.

To pay or tender payment of the Amount of Insurance under this policy together with any costs, attorneys' fees, and expenses incurred by the Insured Claimant that were authorized by the Company up to the time of payment or tender of payment and that the Company is obligated to pay. Upon the exercise by the Company of this option, all ilability and obligations of the Company to the Insured under this policy, other than to make the payment required in this subsection, shall terminate, including any liability or obligation to defend, prosecute, or continue any litigation.

- (b) To Pay or Otherwise Settle With Parties Other Than the Insured or With the Insured Claimant.
 - (i) To pay or otherwise settle with other parties for or in the name of an Insured Claimant any claim insured against under this policy. In addition, the Company will pay any costs, attorneys' fees, and expenses incurred by the Insured Claimant that were authorized by the Company up to the time of payment and that the Company is obligated to pay; or
 - (ii) To pay or otherwise settle with the Insured Claimant the loss or damage provided for under this policy, together with any costs,

attorneys' fees, and expenses incurred by the Insured Claimant that were authorized by the Company up to the time of payment and that the Company is obligated to pay.

Upon the exercise by the Company of either of the options provided for in subsections (b)(i) or (ii), the Company's obligations to the Insured under this policy for the claimed loss or damage, other than the payments required to be made, shall terminate, including any liability or obligation to defend, prosecute, or continue any litigation.

8. DETERMINATION AND EXTENT OF LIABILITY

This policy is a contract of indemnity against actual monetary loss or damage sustained or incurred by the Insured Claimant who has suffered loss or damage by reason of matters insured against by this policy.

- (a) The extent of liability of the Company for loss or damage under this policy shall not exceed the lesser of
 - i) the Amount of Insurance; or
 - the difference between the value of the Title as insured and the value of the Title subject to the risk insured against by this policy.
- (b) If the Company pursues its rights under Section 5 of these Conditions and is unsuccessful in establishing the Title, as insured,
 - (i) the Amount of Insurance shall be increased by 10%, and
 - (ii) the Insured Claimant shall have the right to have the loss or damage determined either as of the date the claim was made by the Insured Claimant or as of the date it is settled and paid.
- (c) In addition to the extent of liability under (a) and (b), the Company will also pay those costs, attorneys' fees, and expenses incurred in accordance with Sections 5 and 7 of these Conditions.

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- (a) If the Company establishes the Title, or removes the alleged defect, llen, or encumbrance, or cures the lack of a right of access to or from the Land, or cures the claim of Unmarketable Title, all as insured, in a reasonably diligent manner by any method, including litigation and the completion of any appeals, it shall have fully performed its obligations with respect to that matter and shall not be liable for any loss or damage caused to the Insured.
- (b) In the event of any litigation, including litigation by the Company or with the Company's consent, the Company shall have no liability for loss or damage until there has been a final determination by a court of competent jurisdiction, and disposition of all appeals, adverse to the Title, as insured.
- (c) The Company shall not be liable for loss or damage to the Insured for liability voluntarily assumed by the Insured in settling any claim or suit without the prior written consent of the Company.

10. REDUCTION OF INSURANCE; REDUCTION OR TERMINATION OF LIABILITY

All payments under this policy, except payments made for costs, attorneys' fees, and expenses, shall reduce the Amount of Insurance by the amount of the payment.

11. LIABILITY NONCUMULATIVE

The Amount of Insurance shall be reduced by any amount the Company pays under any policy insuring a Mortgage to which exception is taken in Schedule B or to which the Insured has agreed, assumed, or taken subject, or which is executed by an Insured after Date of Policy and which is a charge or lien on the Title, and the amount so paid shall be deemed a payment to the Insured under this policy.

12. PAYMENT OF LOSS

When liability and the extent of loss or damage have been definitely fixed in accordance with these Conditions, the payment shall be made within 30 days.

13. RIGHTS OF RECOVERY UPON PAYMENT OR SETTLEMENT

(a) Whenever the Company shall have settled and paid a claim under this policy, it shall be subrogated and entitled to the rights of the Insured Claimant in the Title and all other rights and remedies in respect to the claim that the Insured Claimant has against any person or property, to the extent of the amount of any loss, costs, attorneys' fees, and expenses paid by the Company. If requested by the Company, the Insured Claimant shall execute documents to evidence the transfer to the Company of these rights and remedies. The Insured Claimant shall permit the Company to sue, compromise, or settle in the name of the Insured Claimant and to use the name of the Insured Claimant in any transaction or litigation involving these rights and remedies.

If a payment on account of a claim does not fully cover the loss of the Insured Claimant, the Company shall defer the exercise of its right to recover until after the Insured Claimant shall have recovered its loss.

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(b) The Company's right of subrogation includes the rights of the Insured to indemnities, guaranties, other policies of insurance, or bonds, notwithstanding any terms or conditions contained in those instruments that address subrogation rights.

14. ARBITRATION

Either the Company or the Insured may demand that the claim or controversy shall be submitted to arbitration pursuant to the Title Insurance Arbitration Rules of the American Land Title Association ("Rules"). Except as provided in the Rules, there shall be no joinder or consolidation with claims or controversies of other persons. Arbitrable matters may include, but are not limited to, any controversy or claim between the Company and the Insured arising out of or relating to this policy, any service in connection with its Issuance or the breach of a policy provision, or to any other controversy or claim arising out of the transaction giving rise to this policy. All arbitrable matters when the Amount of Insurance is \$2,000,000 or less shall be arbitrated at the option of either the Company or the Insured. All arbitrable matters when the Amount of Insurance is in excess of \$2,000,000 shall be arbitrated only when agreed to by both the Company and the Insured. Arbitration pursuant to this policy and under the Rules shall be binding upon the parties. Judgment upon the award rendered by the Arbitrator(s) may be entered in any court of competent jurisdiction.

15. LIABILITY LIMITED TO THIS POLICY; POLICY ENTIRE CONTRACT

- (a) This policy together with all endorsements, if any, attached to it by the Company is the entire policy and contract between the Insured and the Company. In interpreting any provision of this policy, this policy shall be construed as a whole.
- (b) Any claim of loss or damage that arises out of the status of the Title or by any action asserting such claim shall be restricted to this policy.
- (c) Any amendment of or endorsement to this policy must be in writing and authenticated by an authorized person, or expressly incorporated by Schedule A of this policy.

(d) Each endorsement to this policy Issued at any time is made a part of this policy and is subject to all of its terms and provisions. Except as the endorsement expressly states, it does not (i) modify any of the terms and provisions of the policy, (ii) modify any prior endorsement, (iii) extend the Date of Policy, or (iv) increase the Amount of Insurance.

16. SEVERABILITY

In the event any provision of this policy, in whole or in part, is held invalid or unenforceable under applicable law, the policy shall be deemed not to include that provision or such part held to be invalid, but all other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

17. CHOICE OF LAW; FORUM

- (a) Choice of Law: The Insured acknowledges the Company has underwritten the risks covered by this policy and determined the premium charged therefore in reliance upon the law affecting interests in real property and applicable to the interpretation, rights, remedies, or enforcement of policies of title insurance of the jurisdiction where the Land is located. Therefore, the court or an arbitrator shall apply the law of the jurisdiction where the Land is located to determine the validity of claims against the Title that are adverse to the Insured and to interpret and enforce the terms of this policy. In neither case shall the court or arbitrator apply its conflicts of law principles to determine the applicable law.
- (b) Choice of Forum: Any litigation or other proceeding brought by the Insured against the Company must be filed only in a state or federal court within the United States of America or its territories having appropriate furisdiction.

18. NOTICES, WHERE SENT

Any notice of claim and any other notice or statement in writing required to be given to the Company under this policy must be given to the Company at 1 First American Way, Santa Ana, CA 92707, Attn: Claims Department.

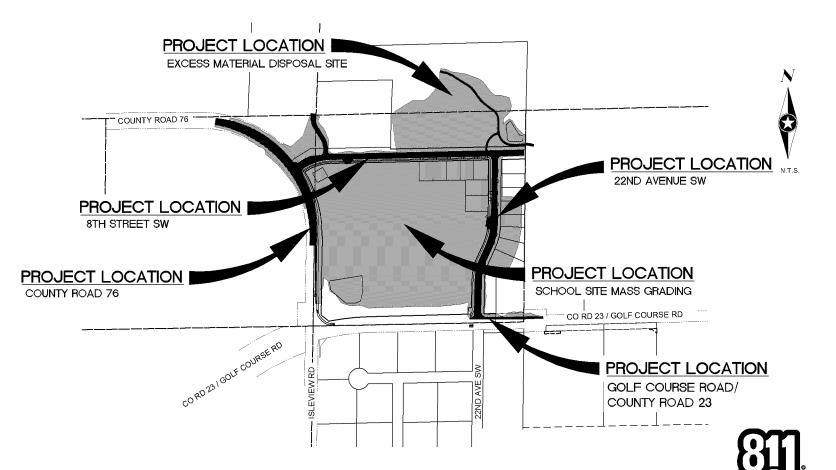

Motion by Commissioner MacGregor, second by Commissioner Zeige to approve the regular agenda as presented. The following voted in favor thereof: Zeige, Lynch, Gothard, MacGregor. Opposed: None, passed unanimously.

Approval of Minutes

Approve the minutes of the October 4, 2018, 4:00 pm regular meeting.

Motion by Commissioner MacGregor, second by Commissioner Gothard to approve the minutes of the October 4, 2018 regular meeting. The following voted in favor thereof: Gothard, MacGregor, Zeige, Lynch. Opposed: None, passed unanimously.

Public Hearings

Conduct a public hearing to consider the preliminary plat of Great River Acres.

Community Development Specialist Trast provided the background information.

A preliminary plat entitled Great River Acres was submitted by Chris Larson, PLS – SEH on behalf of the City of Grand Rapids and filed with the City on February 6, 2019. The property included within the preliminary plat is 41.51 acres in area, including proposed right-of-way, and is located in the NE quadrant adjacent to the Co. Road 76 and Co. Road 23/Golf Course Road intersection. A complete legal description of the subject property is included within the preliminary plat documents.

The staff review committee, consisting of the City Engineer, Public Works Director,

Fire Chief, Grand Rapids PUC, Parks and Recreation Director, and Community Development Department, has reviewed the preliminary plat for technical standards and found that it substantially complies with the City's subdivision requirements. All departments were involved, and provided input, throughout the development of the preliminary plat.

Additionally, the preliminary plat was circulated to the County Highway Engineer, as the plat is accessed off of County Road 76 and County Road 23/Golf Course Road (review comments attached), and to the Commissioner of the MN DNR, as required by MN Shoreland Rules.

Chair Lynch stated the public hearing scheduled for this evening was to consider the preliminary plat of Great River Acres and read the rules for a public hearing.

Motion by Commissioner MacGregor, second by Commissioner Zeige to open the public hearing. The following voted in favor thereof: Zeige, MacGregor, Lynch, Gothard. Opposed: None, motion passed unanimously.

Rich Will, Maintenance Manger at Forest History Center is concerned about the maintenance of the trail and the relocation. Mr. Will said the Forest History Center has not been contacted by anyone regarding the new trail location. In the future the Forest History Center would like to be informed with any plans that pertain to the trail. Mr. Will stated the trail is used quite often and provided trail counts for the Commissioners review.

Motion by Commissioner MacGregor, second by Commissioner Gothard to close the public hearing. The following voted in favor thereof: Zeige, Gothard, Lynch, MacGregor. Opposed: None, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Zeige abstained from any action.

The Commissioners reviewed the considerations for the record.

- 1. Has there been a change in the development policies of the community? Yes, the City is working on updating the Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. Was there a mistake in the original zoning ordinance?

 No, there was not a mistake made in the original zoning ordinance.
- 3. Is the Zoning Ordinance up to date? Yes, the zoning ordinance is up to date.
- 4. Is the proposed subdivision compatible with adjacent land uses? Yes, it is.
- 5. Will the proposed subdivision cause undue traffic congestion?

 No, the County Engineer has reviewed the proposed subdivision and doesn't feel it will cause undue traffic congestion.
- 6. Will the proposed subdivision affect public utilities? Yes, it will extend them to the new development.
- 7. Will the proposed subdivision be detrimental to public health, morals, or general welfare?

No, it will not.

8. Will the proposed subdivision impede orderly development of other property in the area?

No, it will enhance development in the area.

9. Will the proposed subdivision cause a decrease in value of adjacent property?

No, with the devleopment it should increase the value of adjacent property.

- 10. Will the proposed subdivision increase tax revenues?

 Yes, it with the proposed single family development it will increase tax revenues.
- 11. Will the proposed subdivision impose an excessive burden on parks and other public facilities?

No, the trail is being relocated however the Forest History Center would like to be advised of the changes.

12. Is the proposed subdivision consistent with the Comprehensive Plan? Yes, it is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan.

Motion by Commissioner Gothard, second by Commissioner MacGregor that, based on the findings of fact presented here today, and in the public's best interest, the Planning Commission does hereby forward to the City Council a recommendation to approve the preliminary plat of Great River Acres;

• With the condition the Forest History Center is advised of the changes being made to the trail.

The following voted in favor thereof: Gothard, Lynch, MacGregor. Opposed: None, Zeige abstained, motion carried.

Conduct a Public Hearing to consider a variance petition submitted by Independent School District No. 318.

Community Development Specialist Trast provided the staff report.

Independent School District No. 318 (ISD #318) has applied for two variances, which if granted, would allow for the front and street side yard encroachment of the school bus turn-around on the site of the proposed "East Elementary School" generally located between 11th Avenue NE and the City's Sports Complex.

ISD #318 has requested the Planning Commission's consideration of two variances from Section 30-512 Table 2-C of the Municipal Code, which lists District Development Regulations for Surface Parking (minimum yard setbacks). The requested variances, if approved, would allow for the proposed "turn-around" portion school bus lot (only) to encroach 10 ft. and 7 ft. into the required 10 ft. front yard and street side yard setback for surface parking.

Chair Lynch stated the public hearing scheduled this evening is to consider a variance request submitted by Independent School District 318.

Motion by Commissioner MacGregor, second by Commissioner Gothard to open the public hearing. The following voted in favor thereof: Gothard, Lynch,Zeige, MacGregor. Opposed: None, passed unanimously.

Kent Koerbitz, 2032 Knollwood Drive, Grand Rapids a representitive for School District 318 stated the reason for the variance request is for safety.

Motion by Commissioner MacGregor, second by Commissioner Gothard to close the public hearing. The following voted in favor thereof: MacGregor, Gothard, Zeige, Lynch. Opposed: None, passed unanimously.

Commissioner Zeige abstained from any action.

The Commissioners reviewed the following considerations for the record:

- Is this an "Area" variance rather than a "Use" variance?
 This is an area variance.
- 2. Does the proposal put property to use in a reasonable manner? Yes, it will put the property to use in a much safer manner.
- 3. Is the owner's plight due to circumstances which are unique to the property and which are not self-created by the owner?

It is unique to the property and it is not self created by the owner.

- 4. Is the variance in harmony with the purposes and intent of the ordinance? Yes, it is in harmony with the ordinance.
- 5. Will the variance, if granted, alter the essential character of the locality? No, it will not alter the essential character of the locality.
- 6. Is the variance consistent with the comprehensive plan?
 Yes, it provides public safety and puts the property to its best use.

Motion by Commissioner Gothard, second by Commissioner MacGregor that, based on the findings of fact presented here today, and in the public's best interest, the Planning Commission does hereby grant the following variances to Independent School District No. 318 for the property legally described as: S 330 FT OF W 264 FT OF NW SW, Section 15, Range 25W, Township 55N, Itasca County, Minnesota;

• to allow a one-time waiver of the requirements of Section 30-512 Table 2-C of the Municipal Code for the encroachment of the school bus "turn-around" portion (only) a proposed parking lot, which would encroach 10 ft. into the required 10 ft. front yard setback, and 7 ft. into the required 10 ft. setback for surface parking, as depicted in the variance application submitted by Independent School District #318.

The following voted in favor thereof: Gothard, MacGregor, Lynch. Opposed: None, Zeige abstained, motion carried.
