Background Information:

On July 14th, the building department went to address above to look at a dilapidated Accessory structure located at 620 N Pokegama Ave. This was in response to several complaints received due to the conditions of the property. Upon inspecting the structure, it was found to be in such disrepair that the buildings walls and foundation have cracked, foundation undermined, windows broken and some boarded up and no sewer and water usage for several years. This building is unoccupied and has been sitting empty for many years. Recently, GRPD responded to a call where vandalism had taken place where more windows were being broken and appeared that someone was hurt in this process by cutting their hand on the window.

The Building Safety Division's inspection summary listed the following conditions leading to our determination that the structure met the definition of a hazardous structure under the Minnesota State Statute 463.15 to 463.26:

Section 108.1 When a structure or equipment is found by the code official to be unsafe, or when a structure is found unfit for human occupancy, or is found unlawful, such structure shall be condemned pursuant to the provisions of this code.

Section 108.1.3 Structure unfit for human occupancy: A structure is unfit for human occupancy whenever the code official finds that such a structure is unsafe, unlawful or, because of the degree to which the structure is in disrepair or lacks maintenance, is insanitary, vermin or rat infested, contains filth and contamination, or lacks ventilation, illumination, sanitary or heating facilities or other essential equipment required by this code, or because the location of the structure constitutes a hazard to the occupants of the structure or to public.

Details of Violation: Section 110 of the Property Maintenance Code

- The building is found hazardous due to dilapidation taking place due to the lack of maintenance and abandonment. Structure has become dilapidated due to lack of maintenance and abandonment.
- All structural members shall be maintained free from deterioration, and shall be capable of safely supporting the imposed dead and live loads. Structure has large hole next to home that has started to undermine the structures foundation and has several cracks in exterior wall that is causing wall to bow out.
- · All foundation walls shall be maintained plumb and free from open cracks and breaks and shall be kept in such

- condition so as to prevent the entry of rodents and other pests. House has numerous cracks and areas where the exterior wall is not plumb and has cracks in it.
- The roof and flashing shall be sound, tight, and not have defects that admit rain. Verify roof is in sound condition. Front of structure has large bow in it and rot around the roof edge.
- Every window, skylight, door and frame shall be kept in sound condition, good repair, and weather tight. Numerous window around the structure are broken or boarded up as well as rotten and in disrepair.
- · All exterior property and premises, and the interior of every structure, shall be free from any accumulation of rubbish or garbage. Verify home does not have accumulation of garbage or debris inside and outside of home.
- · All kitchen sinks, lavatories, laundry facilities, bathtubs and showers shall be supplied with hot or tempered and cold running water in accordance with the International Plumbing Code. Verify home has properly working facilities as stated and provided with working tempered and cold running water.

The City has given the owner of this property notice by Certified Mail on 7/14/17 with a date of 08/14/17 to remove or repair premises and bring it to a condition where it no longer poses a danger. To this date, nothing has been corrected. Communication was made via phone and she was aware of the conditions but was looking to sell the property. Owner was told these violation stay with the property even if she went to sell.

The next step in rectifying this situation is the adoption of the attached resolution to order the razing of the structure. Within this action, the property owner still has the ability to commence with removal or repair of the building, on their own accord, within 20 days of receiving notice of this order, and if commenced within 20 days, the removal or repair must be complete within 60 days. If no action is taken within these timeframes, the City will move the District Court of Itasca County for summary enforcement of the order and all costs incurred by the City in the demolition would be assessed against the property.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the above-stated facts and in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Sections 463.15 to 463.26, the Grand Rapids City Council hereby Orders that the owner of record of said hazardous building raze or remove the building, or within the time allotted, make repairs to the same described above.

WHEREAS, it is further Ordered that unless action is commenced to raze or remove the building within twenty (20) days after service of this Order and completed within sixty (60) days of such service, or unless such repairs are commenced within twenty (20) days after service of this Order and completed within sixty (60) days after service, or answer served upon the City of Grand Rapids in the manner provided for the service of answer in a civil action within twenty (20) days from the date of service of this Order, then the City of Grand Rapids will move the District Court of Itasca County for summary enforcement of this Order.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Council further Orders that if the City is compelled to take any corrective action herein, all necessary costs expended by the City will be assessed against the real estate concerned and collected in accordance with Minnesota Statutes as required by law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the owners be served a copy of this Order, and the owners shall have to take the following action:

1. Remove or raze the buildings presently upon the property indicated above.

Failure to comply with or answer this Order as required by Minnesota Statute 463.18 will result in the City of Grand Rapids filing a Motion for Summary Enforcement of this Order in the District Court, Itasca County, Minnesota. The owners shall have twenty days from the date of service of this Order to answer specifically and deny such facts contained in this Order if any are in dispute.

Library Department Head Report

November 27, 2017



Our Summer and Fall have been filled with programs and activities. The Library continues to focus on the goals identified in our strategic plan, and on creating a welcoming place for our community.

Strategic Plan Implementation Update

The Library Board, Library staff and representatives from the Friends of the Library, the Library Foundation and the Library's volunteer Program Committee gathered input from the community and developed a revised strategic plan for 2017-2020..

Service Priority # 1: Parents will feel supported in preparing their preschoolers for learning success, and primary students will develop a love of reading and learning.

- Saturday Story Times continued through the Summer and Fall, thanks to the generosity of the Library Foundation. This Summer and Fall the attendance ranged from 19-78 each Saturday, split between 2 sessions. We are the only Library in the area that is open on Saturdays during the summer, so we continue to draw families from throughout Itasca County. We also continued a Monday Book Time during the summer, before resuming the regularly scheduled 2 Story Times each Monday during the school year.
- We have seen many **class visits** already this fall and a few more are scheduled before the end of the year. October is generally a very popular time for class visits. Several Southwest and Murphy 3rd and 4th grade classes have been walking or taking the bus to the Library regularly, and we have had many visits from area preschools, Head Start classes and kindergarten classes.
- Our Winter Reading program, Read with a Friend, will kick off on Saturday, December 16 with a creative program.
- Our Summer Reading Program *Reading By Design* kicked off on May 20th with an opportunity to create a summer idea journal. 864 children signed up throughout the summer and picked up a book log to record their reading or reading-related activities
- Lego Club continued more frequently through the summer, attracting between 30 and 98 participants each session. We are continuing our monthly Lego Club on Tuesdays after school through the school year. Young designers create a small or large item based on a theme (or not) and leave them on display in the children's section during the month.
- We continue to offer additional after-school programming thanks to the Library Foundation.
 Each month we have an art program and a STEAM program. These programs continued through the summer, and we added additional regular summer programs, including Down by the River –outdoor Nature-based programs, and Frieda's Comets –activities based on a biography.
- Summer programming for kids also included programs funded by the Arrowhead Library System and programs funded by the Arts and Culture fund
- We brought a Story Stroll to the Open Streets celebration in June to encourage families to walk and read.
- Over the course of the summer, 1716 kids and families attended 56 programs



Library Department Head Report November 27, 2017



Service Priority # 2: Individuals will be supported in their personal search for knowledge and development of skills and careers.

- Our **summer and fall programming** for adults has included such programs as: *Radon in Your Home, Hiking the Appalachian Trail,* and *WWII Aircraft, Water Wisely*
- We continued an afternoon series called *Get Your Ducks in a Row* which covered a variety of life topics such as estate planning and Medicare overviews. The programs attracted anywhere from 20 -70 people each session.

Service Priority #3: Individuals will have access to online resources that connect them to their community and the world

- Our public computers continue to be used often by people taking **online classes**, those doing homework for local classes, those taking exams for professional licensure, as well as those with daily needs such as email access and a myriad of other communication and printing needs.
- Our public wireless network is in constant use by people bringing their own devices for work, study or communication.
- We replaced our laptops used for training, and this fall we resumed offering a series of classes devoted to basic internet and email tools.

Service Priority #4: Individuals will enjoy varied options that enrich their leisure time, broaden their world view, and inspire their creativity.

- **Legacy-Funded Programs**: We have hosted several programs arranged by Arrowhead Regional Library System including: author *Lorna Landvik, Music from Down Under* (digeridoo)
- **Inspiring Creativity:** We hosted a watercolor painting workshop, and author William Durbin talking about writing historical fiction.
- Alternate Formats are very popular: Circulation of downloadable ebooks and audio books is high. Our patrons downloaded a total of 23,712 during the past year. There are more than 9700 audiobook titles and 12000 ebook titles available to all holders of an ALS library card. All of these are available through our web site.
- For teens, summer break provides a window of opportunity to enjoy reading for pleasure. 37 teens participated in the summer reading challenge. The **Teen Read Week** took place during October. We also repeated our photography contest for teens.
- The **teen Anime Club** continues, bringing teens together monthly to watch an anime movie and talk about anime and manga.

Service Priority #5: Individuals and organizations will experience a comfortable, safe, quiet and welcoming place.

- Our meeting room is heavily utilized by organizations large and small an average of 50/month.
- Our quiet study rooms are used by individuals seeking a quiet space to work or study or a space for 2 people to meet and work.
- We always have a jigsaw puzzle laid out on a table with an open invitation to sit and relax.
- We will continue to take advantage of the space around the library by using it for children's and adult programs. This summer we had a series of programs for kids outside and hosted Copper Street Brass for a riverside concert and a day of river-focused art and activities. We also had outdoor yoga programs in July and August
- Our tables and study rooms provide spaces for working on group projects, popular with high school and college students and people meeting for work or organization related purposes.

Building, and grounds repairs and upgrades

- We replaced the siding on 3 sides of the building, repainted the trim, gutters and downspouts, and caulked wherever wood abutted metal.
- We just received notification that we will be awarded a matching Library Construction and Accessibility Grant from the MN Depart of Education to make modifications that will improve accessibility in the building. We will replace the interior doors with larger doors to accommodate larger wheelchairs and mobility devices, and create a small meeting space that is easily accessible for participants in wheelchairs.

Passports

Our passport service continues, but at a slower pace than we saw last winter. We still anticipate a total of around 1000 applications for the year. People have commented on the convenient hours and location, parking, and the "family friendly" atmosphere.

Staff

- Children's librarian, Darla Kirwin retired effective June 9.
- Tracy Kampa, Children's Library Public Services Clerk, replaced Darla.
- Dion Holcomb-Card replaced Tracy as Children's Library Public Services Clerk.
- Will Richter, Reference Librarian, (and GRFD firefighter) has responded to 52 fire calls so far this year during his shifts at the Library, with a total time spent of 46 hours.
- Amy Dettmer, Assistant Director continues to provide staff support for the Arts and Culture Commission

The Library continues to be very busy, with many people attending programs, borrowing materials, using computers, asking for information, or just hanging out!

Background Information:

The City currently receives professional civil legal services through Chad Sterle, Attorney at Law, as a consultant. The fee for this service in 2018 will be \$132,000. Mr. Sterle, is also currently employed by the State of Minnesota as a public defender, where he defends people who can not afford a private attorney. Through this employment with the State he receives health insurance.

Mr. Sterle would like to drop his employment with the State and end being a public defender. To do this he is requesting that he become a City employee through the attached contract so that he can access health insurance. The City will receive the same services under the attached contract for about the same expense.

Staff Recommendation:

City staff is recommending the approval of the attached employment agreement.

EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made this 27th day of November, 2017, by and between the City of Grand Rapids, a Minnesota corporation ("Employer" or "City"), and Chad B. Sterle, Esq. ("Employee"). The Parties agree as follows:

1. **POSITION**. Employee is hereby designated and appointed as City Civil Attorney to the City of Grand Rapids, and shall serve and be compensated as provided by this Agreement.

2. SCOPE OF WORK.

- a. Employee agrees to perform all necessary legal services as City Attorney, except for those special project exceptions contained in paragraph 3 for which there is a separate contract, and shall:
- (1) Attend and prepare for City Council Meetings;
- (2) Attend occasional special meetings;
- (3) Attend and prepare for Board and Commission meetings as directed by the City Administrator;
- (4) Draft and/or review draft City contracts;
- (5) Review financing, special assessments, bonds and insurance requirements required by or for City contracts or activities;
- (6) Review of municipal contracts, including contracts for public improvement, joint power agreements, construction, equipment purchase; special use conditional agreements, subdivision bonds and development agreements;
- (7) Provide advice on open meeting law and data practices/privacy issues;
- (8) Provide advice and representation on environmental matters;
- (9) Interpret statute without a written legal opinion;
- (10) Research and submission of legal opinions on municipal or other legal matters as requested by the City Council/City Administrator;
- (11) Represent City in all allegations of employee misconduct, and discipline policy violations, as well as perform investigation of such claims.
- (12) This Agreement does not contemplate legal representation of the Grand Rapids Housing and Redevelopment Authority. Representation of that entity will be negotiated directly with the HRA.
- b. Chad Sterle does represent defendants in criminal cases which are alleged to have occurred within Grand Rapids City limits when there is a separate and distinct prosecuting entity such as the Itasca County Attorney's Office.

Mr. Sterle brought this issue to the Grand Rapids City Council for its consideration in 2006, pursuant to Rule of Profession Responsibility 1.7, which states:

(1) A lawyer shall not represent a client if the representation of that client will be directly adverse to another client, unless:

- (1) the lawyer reasonably believes the representation will not adversely affect the relationship with the other client; and
- (2) each client consents after consultation.
- (2) A lawyer shall not represent a client if the representation of that client may be materially limited by the lawyer's responsibilities to another client or to a third person, or by the lawyer's own interests, unless:
 - (1) the lawyer reasonably believes the representation will not be adversely affected; and
 - (2) the client consents after consultation. When representation of multiple clients in a single matter is undertaken, the consultation shall include explanation of the implications of the common representation and the advantages and risks involved.

The Grand Rapids City Council has previously allowed Mr. Sterle to represent criminal defendants who were alleged to have committed a crime within Grand Rapids city limits, but who are being prosecuted by a separate and distinct prosecuting agency.

Now that Mr. Sterle in no way prosecutes for the City of Grand Rapids, the City Council does hereby consent that Mr. Sterle may represent criminal defendants who are alleged to have committed a crime within the municipal boundaries of Grand Rapids in that the matter will be prosecuted by the Itasca County Attorney's Office, or John P. Dimich or any subsequently hired criminal prosecutor. If the City has concerns with a particular case, the parties will mutually discuss how to handle the matter.

- 3. **SPECIAL PROJECTS.** The following services shall be listed as special projects for which the City will contract separately. These include, but are not limited to:
 - (1) Condemnation and eminent domain proceedings for public improvement projects;
 - (2) Zoning and land use regulation matters;
 - (3) The razing and removing of hazardous buildings;
 - (4) Prosecution/resolution of alleged land use violations;
 - (5) Special assessment appeals;
 - (6) Conciliation court matters and unlawful detainer (eviction) actions; and
 - (7) Any other matters requiring litigation and/or the attendance and preparation at court hearings.
- 4. **TERM.** This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect from January 1, 2018, and continue through December 31, 2025 unless terminated by the Employer or Employee as provided in paragraph 8 of this Agreement. This agreement will continue in perpetuity unless a new contract is mutually negotiated by the parties or terminated as specified below.

5. SALARY.

a. Employer shall pay Employee an annual salary of \$100,000 (one-hundred thousand dollars) effective January 1, 2018. Thereafter, Employer agrees to increase

Employee's compensation each year by an amount which is the same as the increases granted to the Employer's other exempt full-time, non-union employees.

- b Employee is not a contract employee but is an employee of the City. As such, Employee will be entitled to the same benefits as provided to Employer's other full-time, non-union employees, which benefits will include contributions such as but not limited to FICA, Medicare, PERA, health, dental and life insurance. Employee will not accrue Flex Time Off (FTO) or Emergency Medical Bank (EMB).
- c. Employee will be reimbursed for actual necessary costs incurred, including but not limited to court filing fees, jury fees, deposition costs, reporters' fees, witness fees, Fed-Ex or other overnight delivery service, title reports, and any other expense not listed above which is necessary to the successful resolution of a client matter.
- d. This Agreement shall be amended automatically to reflect any salary adjustments that are provided or required by the Employer's compensation policies.
- 6. **PENSION PLAN**. Employer shall contribute to PERA as required by State law for Employee. Employer shall also contribute to any other benefit plans consistent with the benefits provided to other full-time, non-union employees of the Employer.
- 7. **EMPLOYER-PROVIDED INSURANCE.** Employer shall provide and pay the premiums for group hospital, medical, dental for Employee and his dependents equal to that which is provided to all other employees. The Employer will also provide life insurance benefits to the Employee in the same amount as provided to all other non-exempt department heads.
- 8. **TERMINATION GUIDELINES/BENEFITS.** Either party may cancel this Contract at any time by giving written notice to the other party at least 180 days prior to the effective date of the termination. Employee shall be paid for the work performed prior to the effective date of termination provided, however, that Employee's cancellation of this contract shall be governed by the MN Rules of Professional Conduct, Rule 1.16, based upon the payment terms of this Contract. Such payment shall not exceed the maximum amount provided for by the terms of this Contract.

Employee shall also be entitled to all other accrual payouts consistent and identical with the benefits granted to the City Administrator in his/her contract.

- 9. **GENERAL CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT**. Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of Employer to terminate the services of Employee at any time, for any reason, subject only to the provisions of this Agreement and statutory requirements. Furthermore, nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of Employee to resign at any time from Employee's position with Employer, subject only to the provisions of this Agreement.
- 10. **CHOICE OF LAW AND VENUE**. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Minnesota. Any disputes, controversies, or claims arising out of this Agreement shall be heard in the state or federal courts of Minnesota,

and all parties to this Agreement waive any objection to the jurisdiction of these courts, whether based on convenience or otherwise.

- 11. **COUNTERPARTS**. This Agreement may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original, but all of which together will constitute one and the same instrument.
- 12. **NOTICES.** Notices regarding this Agreement shall be given in writing to the parties at the following addresses:

- 13. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT**. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the employment relationship between the City and the Administrator, replaces all prior agreements or understandings, and the parties agree that there were no inducements or representations leading to the execution of this Agreement except as herein contained.
- 14. **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT AND NONDISCRIMINATION AND AFFIRMATIVE ACTION.** In connection with the work under this Contract, Employee agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of state and federal equal employment opportunity and nondiscrimination statutes and regulations.
- 15. **LAWS.** Employee will stay fully-informed of all existing and current regulations of the city, county, state and federal laws which in any way limit or control the actions or operations of those engaged upon the work or affecting the materials supplied to or by him. Employee will at all times observe and comply with all ordinances, laws, and regulations.
- 16. **SEVERABILITY**. In case any one or more of the provisions of this Agreement shall be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained in this Agreement will not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.

17. **AMENDMENTS.** This Agreement may be amended by mutual consent of the parties by an instrument in writing.
