Review State Bonding Requests

Mr. Pagel discusses the preliminary submittal deadline for bonding in June 2015. There are currently three items brought forward for consideration. 1) Miss River Pedestrian Bridge; 2) Mississippi River Amphetheatre; and 3) Updates to the IRA Civic Center.

Mr. Pagel indicates that the Pedestrian Bridge should be the #1 priority. Julie Kennedy, City Engineer, discusses ongoing project, planning and agrees that this project should move forward.

Kathy Dodge, Arts & Culture Commission, advised the Council that at the last meeting of the Commission, a decision was made not to recommend moving forward with bond request for a riverfront theatre venue. Dodge stated that the Arts & Culture Commission would like to seek more input from the community and better prepare for a bonding request in the future.

Mr. Solberg states that bond request for the civic center needs to clearly show the impact of the Civic Center on the community is not solely linked to hockey. There are many events, throughout the year, that draw visitors and locals alike, having a large economic impact on the City. A plan needs to be in place for moving forward with updates and improvements for the IRA.

Based on discussion, the Pedestrian Bridge and updates to the IRA Civic Center will be brought back to Council on September 14, 2015 for consideration of bond request.

Apply for Mighty Ducks Grant

Background Information:

The State of Minnesota, acting through its agency, the Minnesota Amateur Sports Commission (MASC), is seeking proposals from interested communities to improve and develop ice arenas. Minnesota communities will be eligible to be awarded grants for developing new ice arenas, improving indoor air quality in ice arenas, or eliminating R-22 refrigerant. As we are only allowed to apply for one of the aforementioned grant types, I feel it is in our best interest to apply for \$135,000 towards the purchase of two electric ice resurfacers (although we need to convert our R-22 refrigerantion system, this grant cycle has set a maximum award of \$50,000 for R-22 conversions and estimates to convert our system are approximately \$750,000) Electric ice resurfacers reduce overall operating costs, eliminate the need for MDH air testing, and ensure clean indoor air quality for our skaters.

Staff Recommendation:

Adopt a resolution authorizing staff to apply for a Mighty Ducks Grant to assist with the purchase of electric ice resurfacers.

Resolutions of support to the State Legislature related to the Western Mesabi Mine Planning Board (WMMPB) legislative initiatives.

Background Information:

Staff Recommendation:

City staff is recommending the approval of the resolutions with the following priority: 1) Adjustment of Fiscal Disparities Formula; 2) Distribution of Production Tax to Local Area; 3) Highway and Railroad Transportation Improvements; 4) Hill Annex Mine State Park; 5) Mesabi Range Deep Drilling Program; and 6) Completion of Legacy Underground Mine Mapping in the Western Mesabi Iron Range.

Requested City Council Action

Consider the approval of the resolutions with the following priority: 1) Adjustment of Fiscal Disparities Formula; 2) Distribution of Production Tax to Local Area; 3) Highway and Railroad Transportation Improvements; 4) Hill Annex Mine State Park; 5) Mesabi Range Deep Drilling Program; and 6) Completion of Legacy Underground Mine Mapping in the Western Mesabi Iron Range.

Councilor

introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

Resolution No. 15 -

Adjustment of Fiscal Disparities Formula

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids is a local government entity organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the finances of cities along the taconite assistance area are under a tax formula referred to as the Iron Range Fiscal Disparities that adjusts and redistributes a significant portion of the growth in commercial and industrial property taxes among local government units in the taconite assistance area, taking money from some government units and giving it to other government units; and

WHEREAS, the existing distribution formula for the taconite assistance area was developed in 1996 and is based upon 1995 property values and other assumptions which are now significantly different than when the present system was created and now needs adjustment because of changes in related indirect tax laws, which have created unpredictability of the tax capacity and tax revenues received on an annual basis; and

WHEREAS, the current fiscal disparities system can result in substantial and unpredictable swings in taxes for local government units from year to year, with negative impact on the ability of local government units to plan their expenditures and levy taxes which in turn also negatively impacts the ability of local taxpayers to predict and plan their tax payments.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids requests the Department of Revenue and the Minnesota state legislature to reconsider and revise the Iron Range fiscal disparities provisions in accordance with HF 1037 and SF 1011 which were introduced in the 2015 legislative session, to better reflect regional economic realities and to provide for better ability to plan budget and tax levies, thereby improving the stability and predictability of local government funding and improving fiscal conditions among many participating government entities, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids, by itself or through a joint powers entity such as the Western Mesabi Mine Planning Board of which it is a member, would like to be informed and involved in the planning for such revisions to the Iron Range fiscal disparities program, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Commissioner of Revenue and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation, with copies sent to each of the state legislators that represent the western Mesabi Range area. Adopted this 14th day of September, 2015.

Resolution No. 15 -

Distribution of Production Tax to Local Area

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids is a local government unit organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the taxation ability of local government units along the Mesabi Iron Range is significantly restricted by state law that establishes special arrangements that apply to iron ore mining, especially the iron ore production tax, such funds being then redistributed by formula to local government units in lieu of some local property taxes; and

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids believes that all local communities within the taconite assistance area should receive financial benefits from iron ore mining and processing; and

WHEREAS, individual local government units are impacted by mining to differing degrees due to factors such as distance from current or past mining, it is reasonable to include some consideration of proportionality in production tax distribution based on factors such as the distance from active or past mining and the resulting impacts each local unit of government must deal with; and

WHEREAS, bills HF 650 and SF 670 were introduced by local legislators in the 2015 state legislature which took into consideration factors such as those mentioned but such bills were not enacted into law during the legislative session;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids requests that the laws of the State of Minnesota be adjusted in accordance with HF 650 and an amended SF 670 to conform with HF 650, so that the production tax distribution formula is clear that local government units that are closest to and most impacted by mining will receive the greatest tax benefit from mining production taxes but that every local government unit within the taconite assistance area will receive at least a defined and assured minimum annual benefit from iron mining production taxes collected; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that calculation and payment of such production tax distributable to local government units be levied and collected on iron from whatever source and in whatever form the iron is produced, be it from tailings, stockpiles, originally mined natural iron ore with or without processing, iron ore concentrates, iron ore pellets, or direct reduced iron, whether the iron unit be used in local production of downstream products or sent elsewhere for further processing, and that such calculation of tax payment take into account both the location of the origin of the iron as well as locations of processing facilities and related ancillary facilities, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids requests the Department of Revenue and the Minnesota state legislature to reconsider and revise the mining tax laws and rules and production tax allocation formulas so that the production tax is collected and distributed in accordance with the preceding principles, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids, by itself or through a joint powers entity such as the Western Mesabi Mine Planning Board of which it is a member, would like to be informed and involved in the planning for such revisions to the statutes governing such production tax collection and distribution, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Commissioner of Revenue and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation, with copies sent to each of the state legislators that represent the western Mesabi Range area.

Highway and Railroad Transportation Improvements

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids is a local government unit organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids believes that transportation infrastructure, especially highways and railways, is vital for use by citizens, for economic health, and for public safety of the City of Grand Rapids and its neighbors; and

WHEREAS, the portion of U.S. Highway 169 from Grand Rapids to Virginia, referred to as the Cross Range Expressway, is a major freight transportation route between Highways 53 and 2 and spans a major industrial area that produces more than 70% of all iron ore in the United States and is a critical part of the United States and state economy, is a major route for transportation of workers in the iron ore industry, their families and dependents, their suppliers, and their products, plus the people involved in numerous other industries and businesses in the region including timber and tourism; and

WHEREAS, there is no reasonable alternative highway for freight or passengers that links the various interests and activities of this important region; and

WHEREAS, part of this critical transportation route is still a 1950s two lane highway, only modestly upgraded, that represents a major restriction on regional traffic flow by confining and limiting economic/business activities and development as well as posing traffic safety hazards and concerns, with traffic counts having risen and expected to significantly continue to rise on this important traffic corridor; and

WHEREAS, this only remaining two lane segment of U.S. Highway 169 has been studied multiple times and in fact had a formal EIS completed in 1989, which may require updating but which means that route alternatives have already been studied which would expedite moving toward significant improvement of the two lane portion of highway to four lanes with some simultaneous alignment and grade improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Transportation has already selected 1.5 miles of this 9 mile length of two lane highway for upgrading to four lanes in 2016 as part of its Corridors of Commerce program, which includes interregional corridor and supplemental freight routes, and completing upgrade of the remaining 7.5 mile two lane portion of such highway would be a logical and significant improvement for both local and regional traffic; and

WHEREAS, railroads are another mode of transportation critical to the local area, region, and state; and

WHEREAS, the western Mesabi area has two Class I railroads and one local railroad but these are limited to one shared track that limits competitive pricing and has physical limitations that substantially restrain full use of railroad transportation for transport of heavy loads such as coal, iron ore, and wood products, which leads to restriction of economic development and greater than desirable transportation of heavy loads on public highways with the costs and hazards thus posed to conventional automotive and over-the-road truck traffic when compared with rail haulage.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids strongly supports assignment of a high priority to transportation infrastructure improvements in the western Mesabi corridor from Cohasset to Keewatin, especially high priority upgrading of the remaining portion of U.S. Highway 169 from Taconite to Pengilly from two lanes to four lanes, including alignment and grade adjustments where needed; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a study be done leading to maintaining and restoring full service on the Class I rail line from Grand Rapids to Keewatin to facilitate local economic development and remove heavy industrial traffic from Highway 169, including provisions improving access to competitive rail freight rates along the rail line from Grand Rapids to Kelly Lake; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids, by itself or through a joint powers entity such as the Western Mesabi Mine Planning Board of which it is a member, would like to be involved as a cooperator or collaborator in the planning for highway and rail transportation improvements in the western Mesabi Range area; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids would appreciate receiving from both the Commissioner of Transportation and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation a written response that describes and explains plans within their current department budgets regarding transportation improvements in the western Mesabi area; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Commissioner of Transportation and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation, with copies to each of the elected United States congressional officials and state legislators that represent the western Mesabi Iron Range area.

Hill Annex Mine State Park

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids is a local government unit organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREA, the City of Grand Rapids is actively involved in identifying, planning and encouraging development and use of local assets for the benefit of its citizens and the State of Minnesota in ways that preserve the availability of the iron ore resource; and

WHEREAS, the local area has a strong iron mining heritage that has had a strong role in the local and state economy, in developing technology and providing resources that have benefited the local area, the state, the nation, and the world; and

WHEREAS, it is important that citizens be educated about the important resources of their state, including iron ore, and that they understand the history, technology, culture, economic importance, and other aspects of this industry that has been and continues to be so important to the local area, the State, and the nation; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota is unique in having several state parks featuring and educating people about different aspects of this iron mining heritage and resource, one of these being Hill Annex Mine State Park which is located in the immediate area; and

WHEREAS, the Hill Annex Mine State Park has substantial infrastructure, buildings, historic, and natural features, some of which are one of a kind, and these features require maintenance, care, and attention so that they are in safe and proper condition to perform the educational mission of the state park system of which they are a part; and

WHEREAS, the Hill Annex Mine State Park provides employment and has the potential to provide direct and indirect current and future economic benefits to the State and the local area; and

WHEREAS, in recent years the park has been gradually falling into disrepair, has had very limited open days and hours, and may have been underpromoted, which together have resulted in lower visitor numbers and admission receipts, both of which trends, if continued, result in lower employment, lower economic benefits, and eventual loss of the state park as a viable attraction and unable to fulfill its goals; and

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids feels that preservation, maintenance, and improvements to the Hill Annex Mine State Park are important and may become even more important to the future of the State, the State's residents, and the local area; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids strongly encourages the state and its relevant departments to make a strong policy statement regarding the value and benefits of the Hill Annex Mine State Park and encouraging realization of the full benefits offered by the Park; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids strongly encourages the 2015 Minnesota Legislature to appropriate and allocating adequate state funds specifically for

the Hill Annex Mine State Park so that it can properly fill its important educational and economic role, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such funds for Hill Annex Mine State Park be used for operational, maintenance, and repair purposes including expeditiously developing a plan to identify specific actions to be taken so that the park can better fulfill its mission, such specific actions to include at a minimum improved marketing of the park, maintenance and repair funds to allow maintaining current facilities and existing buildings, capital funds for major renovations to existing buildings and possible extensions or additions to improve the visitor draw of the park, improved labeling and identification of important buildings and features of the park for their better understanding by park visitors, adding knowledgeable guides and other park personnel, extending days and hours of park operation, and establishing long term goals that lead to making the park more economically self-supporting over a five year time period; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids, by itself or through a joint powers entity such as the Western Mesabi Mine Planning Board of which it is a member, would like to be involved as a cooperator or collaborator in the planning for improvements for the future of the Hill Annex Mine State Park; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids would appreciate receiving from both the Commissioner of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation a written response that describes and explains plans within their current department budgets regarding the Hill Annex Mine State Park and an expression of DNR and IRRRB interest in improving the state park; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Commissioner of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation, with copies to each of the state legislators that represent the western Mesabi Iron Range area.

Mesabi Range Deep Drilling Program

WHEREAS, the City of Grand Rapids is a local government unit organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, for more than a century, iron ore mining has been and continues to be the economic pillar of Northeastern Minnesota but little technical information exists about the iron formation south of the immediate limits of the historic and current iron ore mines; and

WHEREAS, ability to perform comprehensive long term plans and make good use of public funds for infrastructure, economic development and zoning plans, and other public purposes is best done using good information, including data about iron ore resources, development of which could significantly impact the type and location of infrastructure, municipal, county, state, and other development, especially with the advent of new mining and processing technologies and changes in the relative market value of minerals; and

WHEREAS, northeastern Minnesota has technical professionals and several service providers capable of planning and performing the various steps and tasks involved in better defining the extent and nature of the iron ore resource in northeastern Minnesota, information about which would be useful for planning purposes; and

WHEREAS, a limited deep drilling program originally planned in the 1960s was terminated prior to completion and there have been important developments since that time so that the need for long term information about the iron ore resource continues to exist, has increased, and is expected to further increase.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids strongly encourages the allocation and use of adequate state funds by the Department of Natural Resources Division of Lands and Minerals to plan and implement a substantial deep core drilling program south of the historic and current mining area along the Mesabi Iron Range, preferably with priority to the western portion of the Iron Range, including appropriate logging, analysis and testing of core produced by such a program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids, by itself or through a joint powers entity such as the Western Mesabi Mine Planning Board of which it is a member, would like to be involved as a cooperator or collaborator in the planning for such program and to be apprised of the results of such deep core drilling program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids would appreciate receiving from both the Commissioner of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation a written response that describes and explains plans within the current department budget regarding the requested deep drilling program or that will result in the department from recent legislative action or as a result of other

planning, and an expression of DNR and IRRRB interest in arranging for and conducting such deep drilling program; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Commissioner of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation, with copies to each of the state legislators that represent the western Mesabi Iron Range area.

Completion of Legacy Underground Mine Mapping in the Western Mesabi Iron Range

WHEREAS, for more than a century, iron ore mining has been the economic pillar of Northeastern Minnesota, and this included underground mining using legacy technology that in some cases left underground voids, some of which have openings have projected to surface and some of which are still hidden underground and are not yet known, in areas that now impact planning for and use of land because of public safety concerns; and

WHEREAS, technical personnel and technology have the ability to identify and map many of the legacy underground mine areas that could pose public safety hazards, the map products of which would reduce the likelihood of negative unintended consequences of current or future activities that could be prevented if potentially hazardous areas are better known; and

WHEREAS, research and mapping of the central and eastern Mesabi Iron Range has already been completed and only the western Mesabi Range, from approximately Keewatin westward, which includes areas in which historic underground mining may have been more significant than generally realized and in places not yet known, remains for mapping of the locations of legacy underground iron ore mining; and

WHEREAS, this is a one-time project for which no annual operating funds exist and for which none are expected to be needed once the mapping of legacy underground mine workings is complete.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids strongly encourages the allocation and use of adequate state funds by either the Department of Natural Resources Division of Lands and Minerals or the Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board to enable completion of the last stage of the Mesabi Range underground mine mapping project on the western Mesabi Iron Range; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids, by itself or through a joint powers entity such as the Western Mesabi Mine Planning Board of which it is a member, would like to be involved as a cooperator or collaborator in the planning for such program and to be apprised of the results of such program to map legacy underground mines; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Grand Rapids would appreciate receiving from both the Commissioner of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation a written response that explains any plans within the current department budget regarding the requested completion of the mapping of legacy underground mines on the western Mesabi Range, and an expression of interest in arranging for and conducting the last stage of such mapping project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution be sent to the Commissioner of Natural Resources and the Commissioner of Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation, with copies sent to each of the state legislators that represent the western Mesabi Range area.

Background Information:

Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) established GASB statements 67 & 68, Financial Reporting for Pension Plans, which are required to be implemented in 2015. Statement 68 replaces the requirements of Statement No. 27, Accounting for Pensions by State and Local Governmental Employers, as well as the requirements of Statement No. 50, *Pension Disclosures*. GASB 68 applies to accounting for pension plan sponsors (municipalities). Any financial reporting done for the pension plan sponsor (the City) should be prepared in accordance with GASB 68 and is effective for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2015.

Statement No. 67, Financial Reporting for Pension Plans, revises existing standards of financial reporting for most pension plans. This Statement replaces the requirements of Statement 25, Financial Reporting for Defined Benefit Pension Plans and Note Disclosures for Defined Contribution Plans. Statement 25 and Statement 67 establish a definition of a pension plan that reflects the primary activities associated with the pension arrangement-determining pensions, accumulating and managing assets dedicated for pensions, and paying benefits to plan members as they come due. Any financial reporting done for the pension plan (Relief Association) should be prepared in accordance with GASB 67 and is effective for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2014.

Staff Recommendation:

AGREEMENT FOR CONSULTING SERVICES

This Agreement f Iting Services ("Agreement") is entered into and dated August 20, 2015 by and between Hildi Inc. with offices located at 11800 Singletree Lane, Suite 305, Minneapolis, MN 55344 (hereinafter referred to as the "Consultant") and the City of Grand Rapids with offices located at 420 North Pokegama Avenue, Grand Rapids, MN 55744-2662 (hereinafter referred to as the "Company"). Company and Consultant are jointly referred to as the "parties."

IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES CONTAINED HEREIN, AND FOR OTHER GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, THE SUFFICIENCY OF WHICH IS HEREBY ACCEPTED, THE PARTIES MUTUALLY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. <u>Description of Services</u>. Consultant will perform certain services for Company upon terms and conditions specified herein and as such services are more particularly described in Exhibit(s), which are attached hereto and incorporated by this reference.
- 2. <u>Prices and Payment</u>. Company agrees to pay Consultant the fees set forth in the applicable Exhibit(s). Consultant anticipates invoicing the Company monthly for services provided. Payment will be due in full within fifteen (15) days of receipt of Consultant's invoice. Company agrees to pay interest on all overdue amounts at a rate of twelve percent (12%) per annum or the rate allowed by law, which ever is less, plus costs of collection, court costs, and reasonable attorney fees on all such amounts.
- 3. <u>Travel Expenses</u>. Company agrees to reimburse Consultant for its reasonable and necessary out-of-pocket lodging, transportation, and food incurred at the Company's request. Consultant agrees to provide reasonable expense documentation. Whenever possible, Consultant agrees to take advantage of travel discounts. All air travel by Consultant shall be on major national or regional airlines, and Consultant and its representatives may keep their frequent flier miles earned for their personal usage.
- 4. <u>Ownership of Work Product</u>. Ownership of, and all rights in, the work product which is the subject matter of this Agreement (the "Work"), including trademarks, patents and copyrights applicable to same, shall belong exclusively to Company. The parties expressly agree to consider as a "work made for hire" any Work ordered or commissioned by the Company which qualifies as such under the United States copyright laws. To the extent that the Work cannot be a "work made for hire" or where necessary for any other reason, Consultant will provide Company with all such assignments of rights, covenants and other assistance which may be required for Company, through trademark, patent or copyright applications or otherwise, to obtain the full benefit of the rights provided for herein. If the Work contains materials previously developed or copyrighted by Consultant or others, Consultant grants and agrees to grant to Company, or obtain for Company, an unrestricted, royalty-free license to use and copy such materials. Any license so

granted or obtained shall include the right for Company to grant an unrestricted, royalty-free license to any affiliate of Company. Consultant is allowed to retain one copy of the Work for archival purposes. Consultant shall place a copyright notice on the Work at Company's request. The Work shall be considered "Information" under the Section entitled "Nondisclosure."

- 5. Nondisclosure. Any technical or business information, including, but not limited to, computer programs, files, specifications, drawings, sketches, models, samples, tools, cost data, customer information, financial data, business or marketing plans or other data, whether oral, written or otherwise ("Information"), furnished or disclosed to Consultant hereunder or in contemplation hereof, shall remain Company's property. No license, express or implied, under any trademark, patent or copyright is granted by Company to Consultant by virtue of such disclosure. All such information in written, graphic or other tangible form shall be returned to the Company immediately upon request and copies shall be returned to the Company or, at Company's option, certified by Consultant as having been located and destroyed. Consultant shall be allowed to retain one copy of the Information for archival purposes. Unless such Information was previously known to Consultant free of any obligation to keep it confidential, is lawfully obtained by Consultant from any source other than Company or has been or is subsequently made public by Company or a nonparty to this Agreement, is approved for release by written authorization of the Company, or is required by law to be disclosed in response to a valid order of a court of competent jurisdiction or authorized governmental agency, provided the Company receives adequate notice to allow it to request a protective order and the Consultant reasonably cooperates with the Company's efforts to receive a protective order, it shall be kept confidential by Consultant for the benefit of Company, shall be used only in performing under this Agreement and shall not be used for other purposes except upon such terms as may be agreed upon by Company in writing. Consultant shall take reasonable steps to protect such Information to a similar extent that Consultant protects its own Information.
- 6. <u>Liability</u>. Consultant shall indemnify Company and its affiliates against, and shall hold Company and its affiliates harmless from, any loss, damage, expense or liability that may in any way arise out of or result from the performance of Consultant hereunder and caused by or resulting from the gross negligence or intentional misconduct of Consultant, including but not limited to any knowing infringement, or claim of infringement, of any patent, trademark, copyright, trade secret or other proprietary right of a third party or of Consultant or anyone claiming through Consultant who may be eligible to terminate any assignment or transfer made hereunder pursuant to the terms of the copyright laws up to the amount paid by the Company to the Consultant under a given applicable Exhibit(s). Consultant shall defend or settle, at its own expense, any action or suit against Company or its affiliates for which it is responsible hereunder. Company shall notify Consultant of any such claim, action or suit and shall reasonably cooperate with the Consultant (at Consultant's expense) to facilitate the defense of any such claim.

- 7. <u>Limitation</u>. In no event shall company or consultant be liable, one to the other, for indirect, special, incidental, or consequential damages arising out of or in connection with the furnishing, performance or use of any products or services provided pursuant to this agreement.

Review suggested amendments to City Code Section 38-1, Blight Elimination of Article I of Chapter 38 - Nuisances of the Grand Rapids Municipal Code.

Background Information:

The Grand Rapids Police Department has drafted an Ordinance to amend the City Code as it pertains to blight. During a bus tour of City projects, the Council made note of many blighted residences around the community, specifically involving motor vehicles. Councilmembers have also received calls from the public regarding this same blight issue. As the City Code is currently written, enforcement is difficult. The proposed changes will clarify blight and simplify enforcement. Please note that earlier this year, a change was made by the Zoning Commission regarding zoning issues and the Nuisance code, that differ in nature from the changes proposed in the attached ordinance. The zoning changes dealt specifically with the parking of campers and boats in a residential front yard, and the amendments recommended today deal with the blight caused by non-registered motor vehicles and "junk" vehicles.

Review and adopt proposed changes by City Ordinance.

Consider adopting a City Ordinance amending Chapter 38-1, Blight Elimination, Article I of Chapter 38 - Nuisances of the Grand Rapids Municipal Code and authorize publication in summary form.

Councilor introduced the following ordinance and moved for its adoption:

ORDINANCE NO. 15-09-

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 38-1, BLIGHT ELIMINATION OF ARTICLE I OF CHAPTER 38 – NUISANCES OF THE GRAND RAPIDS MUNICIPAL CODE

WHEREAS, paragraph (1) of the current ordinance does not provide a guideline for the maximum days in which a "junk automobile" can be stored in the open; and

WHEREAS, paragraph (1) also indicates that more than one criteria be met in order to declare a violation of the current ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council, on September 14, 2015, reviewed the proposed changes to Section 38-1, Blight Elimination of Article I or Chapter 38 – Nuisances of the Grand Rapids City Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVOED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GRAND RAPIDS, MINNESOTA, that the proposed amendments to Section 38-1, Blight Elimination of Article I of Chapter 38 – Nuisances of the City Code are in the best interest of the public's health, safety, and general welfare, and hereby ordains that the Grand Rapids City Code be amended as follows: See Exhibit A.

This Ordinance shall become effective after its passage and publication.

EXHIBIT "A"

Sec. 38-1. – Blight elimination.

- (a) Causes of blight or blighting factors. It is determined that the uses, structures, activities and causes of blight or blighting factors described in this section, if allowed to exist, will tend to result in blighted and undesirable neighborhoods so as to be harmful to the public welfare, health and safety. No person shall maintain or permit to be maintained any of these causes of blight or blighting factors upon any property in the city owned, leased, rented or occupied by such person, firm or corporation:
 - (1) In any area zoned for residential and residential business purposes, the storage upon any property of junk automobiles. For the purpose of this chapter, the term "junk automobiles" shall include any motor vehicle, part of a motor vehicle, or former motor vehicle, stored in the open for a period greater than ninety (90) days, which is not currently licensed for use upon the highways of the state, and or is either:
 - a. Unusable or inoperable because of lack of, or defects in component parts;
 - Unusable or inoperable because of damage from collision, deterioration, or having been cannibalized;
 - c. Beyond repair and therefore not intended for future use as a motor vehicle; or
 - d. Being retained on the property for possible use of salvageable parts.
 - (2) In any area zoned as a residential district, residential business or commercial district the storage or accumulation of junk, trash, rubbish or refuse of any kind, except refuse stored in such a manner as not to create a nuisance for a period not to exceed 30 days. The term "junk" shall include parts of machinery or motor vehicles, unused stoves or other appliances stored in the open; remnants of wood; decayed, weathered or broken construction materials no longer suitable for safe, approved building materials; metal or any other material or cast off material of any kind whether or not the same could be put to any reasonable use.
 - (3) In any area the existence of any structure or part of any structure which because of fire, wind, or other natural disaster, or physical deterioration is no longer habitable as a dwelling, nor useful for any other purpose for which it may have been intended.
 - In any area zoned for residential purposes, the existence of any vacant dwelling, garage, or other outbuildings, unless such buildings are kept securely locked, windows kept glazed or neatly boarded up and otherwise protected to prevent entrance to vandals.
 - (5) In any area the existence of any noxious or poisonous vegetation such as poison ivy, ragweed or other poisonous plants, or any weeds, grass, brush or plants which are a fire hazard or otherwise detrimental to the health or appearance of the neighborhood.
- (b) Enforcement and penalties.
 - (1) The owner and the occupant of any property upon which any of the causes of blight or blighting factors set forth in subsection (a) of this section are found to exist shall be notified in writing by the chief of police to remove or eliminate such causes of blight or

blighting factors from such property within ten days after service of the notice upon him. Such notices may be served personally or by mailing the same by registered mail, return receipt requested, to the last known address of the owner and, if the premises are occupied, to the premises. Additional time may be granted by the enforcement officer where bona fide efforts to remove or eliminate such causes of blight or blighting factors are in progress. Failure to comply with such notice within the time allowed shall constitute a misdemeanor.

(2) In case of failure to remove any blight as defined in subsection (a) of this section within the time prescribed, the Chief of Police may order the Public Works Superintendent to cut down and remove or otherwise destroy all such noxious, inflammable or detrimental vegetation, and shall certify the cost thereof to the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall certify such cost to the County Auditor as a special assessment against the property involved for collection in the same manner as other special assessments. As an additional or alternative remedy, the owners of any interest in such land and the occupant shall be jointly and severally liable for such costs and the costs shall be recoverable in any action brought against any of them in the name of the city.

Termination of Lease with Showboat Inc.

Background Information:

Since 2002 the City and UPM/Blandin have been preparing for future industrial development in the general area of Syndicate Division located west of Blandin's existing wood yard. This area contains Showboat Landing which is owned by the City and leased to Showboat Inc. (see attached). In addition, the stage at Showboat has deteriorated to the point of be a safety hazard to the public. The following is a brief chronology of the transition of property.

1. In 2003 - The City's comprehensive plan which includes land use recommended the transition of property west of the Blandin wood yard from residential/public use to industrial use.

2. In 2008 - The Planning Commission recommended and the City Council approved the rezoning of property from residential/public use to Industrial. Every property owner was notified three times by mail inviting them to a neighborhood meeting and two public hearings. (see attached).

3. Between 2002 and Present - UPM/Blandin has acquired the former Hawkinson Construction and ISD 318 School Bus Facility which abut the City property on the west and north, along with 14 single family homes.

4. In 2009 - The City, in partnership with UPM/Blandin, secured an IRRRB grant to demolish two single family homes and two commercial buildings.

5. In 2011 - The City updated its comprehensive plan which reinforced the desire for the property to be utilized for future industrial development.

6. On June 5, 2015 - The City Administrator gave written preliminary notice to Showboat indicating that the Lease would likely be terminated this year (see attached).

7. In July of 2015 - The City Public Works Department removed the bleachers and ADA observation ramps due to safety issues.

Staff Recommendation:

City staff is recommending the termination of a Lease Agreement with Showboat, Inc. due to the structural deficiencies of the stage and the pending plan to transfer the property to UPM/Blandin.

LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") is made and executed on <u>June 11</u>, 2013, between the CITY OF GRAND RAPIDS, a Minnesota municipal corporation, (the "Lessor"), and SHOWBOAT, INC., (the "Lessee").

WHEREAS, Lessee owns and operates a riverboat from which it performs a yearly variety show, showcasing local talent in the form of singing, dancing and theater performances; and

WHEREAS, Lessor owns property which it intends to lease to Lessee for the purpose of allowing Lessee to conduct the affairs of the Lessor described below. ("Permitted Purpose");

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the terms and conditions herein the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

1. PROPERTY: Lessor hereby leases to Lessee the following real property, building and site amenities/furnishings (the "Premises") located in the City of Grand Rapids, County of Itasca, as depicted in the attached Exhibit A:

2. TERM: This Lease shall be a month to month tenancy. Either party may terminate this lease by providing the other party 90 (ninety) days written notice.

3. PERMITTED PURPOSE: The Premises may be used by the Lessee for the purpose of conducting Showboat Inc. organizational meetings, rehearsals and performances and storage within the building depicted in Exhibit A.

4. RENT: Lessee agrees to pay \$1.00 per year as rent for the Premises, with said payment due to the Lessor on or before the first day of January.

5. INSURANCE: Lessee shall maintain a policy of insurance at its own cost and expense insuring Lessor and Lessee from all claims, demands or actions for injury or death of any person in the same amount as the maximum liability to which the Lessor is exposed pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 466.04 and subsequent amendments thereto.

The policy or duly executed certificate shall provide that the insurance cannot be canceled unless at least thirty (30) days advance written notice is given to the Lessor.

6. USE OF LEASED PROPERTY: It is anticipated Lessee will be using the Premises for approximately 6 months of each year. During this time Lessee will use the Premises only for the Permitted Purpose and for no other use without Lessor's prior written consent. Lessee shall not, and Lessee shall ensure that its employees, agents, representatives, assigns, invitees, guests and concessionaires do not, use, store or dispose of hazardous substances on the Premises. Lessee

shall indemnify Lessor from and against any liability arising out of the use, storage or disposal of hazardous substances on the Premises during the term of the Lease.

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7. IMPROVEMENTS, REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE: Lessee shall maintain the Premises in the same condition and shall keep the Premises in a safe and sanitary condition during its Permitted Use. Lessee agrees to repair any damage to the Premises because of the use of the Premises. Lessee is responsible for restoring the Premises to its previous condition after its Permitted Use or upon termination or expiration of this Lease.

Lessee may only alter the subject area with Lessor's prior written consent. Lessee agrees that Lessee is responsible for any costs associated with any such improvements, and will not receive compensation from the Lessor for those costs upon the termination or expiration of this Lease. Lessee agrees to remove any such improvements upon termination or expiration of this Lease if requested by Lessor.

Lessee agrees to collaborate with the City Police Department to ensure that loitering or other public nuisances are prevented, to the extent possible.

8. INDEMNITY: Lessee agrees to indemnify and save Lessor harmless against any and all claims, damages, costs and expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees for the defense thereof, arising out of the use of the Premises by Lessee or its employees, agents, representatives, assigns, invitees, guests, and concessionaires, arising from the conduct of or management of the Permitted Use or from any breach or default on the part of Lessee, its agents, contractors, servants, employees, and concessionaires in or about the Premises.

In such case of any action or proceeding brought against Lessor by reason of such claim, upon notice from Lessor, Lessee covenants to defend such action and satisfy any final judgment or award resulting therefrom.

9. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING: Lessee may not assign or sublet said Premises without the prior written approval of the Lessor. The parties agree, however, that such assignment does not release the Lessee from any obligation under this Lease.

10. TERMINATION: Either party may cancel this Lease upon 90 days' written notice to the other party at:

11. SURRENDER OF POSSESSION: At the expiration or termination of this Lease, Lessee shall surrender possession of the Premises in the same condition it was in as of the commencement date.

12. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: Lessee and Lessor agree that this Lease as written represents the entire agreement between the parties and that there are no other agreements, written or oral, between the parties hereby pertaining to the Premises.

This Lease may not be amended or supplemented orally but only by an agreement in writing which has been signed by the parties.

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

Dear Property Owner:

As you know, the City of Grand Rapids began a phased expansion of its corporate area in the year 2000 by way of a joint resolution with Grand Rapids Township. Related to this process, the City adopted a new Comprehensive Plan in 2004, and revised the City Zoning Ordinance in 2007. The next step will involve updating and revising the Official Zoning Map, which designates the zoning classification of all properties in the City, and in areas already scheduled for annexation. While some of the geographic areas identified for zoning district changes lay within the original boundary of the City, much of the need for this update is necessitated by the newly incorporating areas, which were previously regulated by the Itasca County Ordinance.

At this time, the City's Ordinance has placed all land subject to annexation into an R-1 (One family residence) zoning district classification. In many areas, this designation is intended to be temporary, remaining only until such time as rezoning is considered either through a private application, or by City initiation. With the necessary steps first steps of Comprehensive Plan adoption and Ordinance revision completed, the Planning Commission has recently formally initiated this process to consider establishing appropriate zoning. The Planning Commission and City staff, together with a planning consultant hired to assist in this effort, have identified existing land uses, and land use recommendations within the Comprehensive Plan to produce the initial proposed zoning classifications for each area, and the parcels within. A map of the initial proposed zoning designations, for your area, is included with this letter.

In addition to the required public hearings for a rezoning, the City is holding a series of public meetings to provide information regarding the proposed draft zoning map and to solicit comments. In order for a more focused discussion, the City has divided the entire area proposed for revision into four sub-areas with individual meeting dates and times. Our records indicate that you own property which is located in Meeting Area 1. The first meeting pertaining to this area will be held on Tuesday, June 3rd, 2008 at 6:30

pm in the IRA Civic Center (general lobby area) at: 1401 Northwest 3rd Avenue, Grand Rapids, MN



Showboat Landing (formally known as Syndicate Park) at 121 16th Ave NW, Grand Rapids, Minnesota 55744, is a one-of-a-kind entertainment venue & historical feature in the community which celebrated its 60th anniversary this year (2015). It is the only outdoor stage on the whole length of the Mississippi River. Showboat landing sits in a bend on the river among stately pines and is home to families of geese, loons and other wildlife. The Landing is public land managed by the City of Grand Rapids and was industrially zoned in 2003. The city earmarked the property for a land swap with UPM Blandin paper company to build a wood processing (biofuel) plant. This would mean the loss of a historic Mississippi River site and a much loved community venue, not to mention disruption and potential loss of land value for the local homeowners next to the site and negative environmental consequences. We are not against industry, nor are we against biofuel. But we are against the City of Grand Rapids destroying historical and artistic landmarks along the Mississippi River that possess so much economic, tourism, and community value for us. In 2003 the City of Grand Rapids' Comprehensive Plan re-zoned the entire northwest shoreland of the Mississippi to industrial status.

In 2004-2006 an environmental impact statement was produced by the Minnesota DNR on the proposed expansion of UPM into the Showboat / Syndicate park area. Community members sent in letters (40 in total) and informed the DNR that the use of Syndicate Park and Showboat Landing/fishing dock must be preserved. The sentiment expressed within the letters received from the community, tells us that even two years after being zoned industrial, we - the community were expressing our need to protect our valuable community asset - Showboat Landing/Syndicate Park. (http://files.dnr.state.mn.us/input/environmentalreview/UPMBlandin/responses.pdf)

In 2011 the comprehensive planning process maintained the recommendations of 2003's initial Comprehensive Plan, noting the future development of the Showboat Landing / Syndicate park area by UPM. Of the 1100 responses, about 800 were from landowners aged 50 and older. (<u>http://www.cityofgrandrapidsmn.com/doing-business/comp-plan</u>, Appendix 2). While Cultural & Recreational opportunities were the second lowest-ranked values in the 2011 survey, our community not only remembers these values four years later, but a wider portion of the community is now just becoming aware that the study even took place and the dire circumstances that await our beloved venue. Perhaps the 1100 respondents to the initial survey for the comprehensive plan, simply weren't representative of the greater population back then.

Regardless, we are here to challenge the priorities and say it is a priority for our community, for our economy, for our county's \$60 million tourism & resort industry, for us now, and for the Grand Rapids of future generations - to SAVE SHOWBOAT LANDING!

This Monday September 14th at 5pm, you - the Grand Rapids City Council are meeting to vote on the termination of a tenant lease by non-profit organization Grand Rapids Showboat, Inc. We, the community know that this vote will lead way to the land swap/purchase of Showboat Landing/Syndicate Park with UPM Blandin Paper.

As members of the community you serve, we are urgently calling upon you to request & advise you - our council, administrator, mayor, and staff:

- 1. Cease all current negotiations for selling or trading the land of Showboat Landing or Syndicate Park to industry.
- 2. Re-zone Showboat Landing & Syndicate park to allow development as a park, community entertainment venue, and business site. We have reconsidered the value of the property to the community. We call for a revision to the comprehensive plan starting now.
- 3. Encourage open and free communication: return to your values of informing citizens of potential arrangements that would directly impact us and our enjoyment of community-owned or personal property. Many homeowners next to the landing (and citizens) have been in the dark about plans for Showboat Landing/Syndicate Park. There needs to be more transparency; just because some of the 1100 survey respondents agreed to keep the zoning, doesn't mean the other 9000 of us were aware of such a drastic change to our community. We, the citizens of Grand Rapids need to be informed of what is happening in our community!
- 4. While the City was looking to invest \$1.5 million of our money into a new river venue elsewhere (at Forest History Center), as the city is not moving forward with that plan, we instead call for a fraction of that amount to be invested into renovating the current site to strengthen our community's presence on the Mississippi & expand opportunities on the river.

5. While we are not the non-profit organization known as Grand Rapids Showboat, Inc. - we are aware next Monday's council meeting (September 14) will vote to terminate the long-held lease for Showboat Landing. Because of the reason behind this vote (UPM expansion) - we ask this process to be moved from the consent agenda to a separate item, discussion, and vote.

While we recognize the years of efforts to move the city forward as a whole, we need to be sure that this process remains under the direction of the community. We owe it to future generations to be good stewards of our city, our land and our history!

Termination of Arbo Agreement and reclassification of Public Works employees.

Background Information:

The City of Grand Rapids entered into an interlocal agreement with Arbo Township on September 24, 2012 for public works maintenance services. The agreement was modified on October 28, 2013 and again on March 9, 2015. In the agreement, it stipulates that either party may terminate this agreement upon 60 days written notice to the other. We would like to terminate the agreement effective December 31, 2015. Jeff Wilson, Public Works Maintenance II would be utilized in the City of Grand Rapids on a full-time basis, where he was with Arbo for approximately half of his time, and with the City of Grand Rapids as needed and as available.

Along with this change, we are requested to promote Steve Anderson, Public Works Maintenance II, to the full-time position of Maintenance and Stormwater Specialist. The position has been reviewed by Springsted and it has been determined that the pay rate should be equivalent to that of the ROW Lead Person, which is \$24.8653 per hour, and with longevity would make his new pay \$25.3653 per hour. This would be effective September 1, 2015.

And finally, we would like to change the classification for the Building/Airport Maintenance Worker to Building Maintenance/Airport Lead Person. Everett Baumgarner is currently in that position; his pay would increase to from \$22.7466 (Maintenance II) to \$24.0083 (Mechanic and Building Maintenance/Airport Lead Person) effective September 1, 2015.

Staff Recommendation:

City Administrator Tom Pagel, Public Works Director Jeff Davies, City Engineer Julie Kennedy, and Human Resources Director Lynn DeGrio have met and worked on this proposal during the last few months. Along with that, we've worked with Springsted to determine the new pay rates for each position. Therefore, we are recommending the above changes be made.

Requested City Council Action

Consider (1) terminating the Arbo agreement effective December 31, 2015; (2) transferring Jeff Wilson to the Public Works Maintenance II position for Grand Rapids effective January 1, 2016; (3) transferring Steve Anderson to the fulltime Maintenance and Stormwater Specialist position at a rate of \$25.3653 effective September 1, 2015; and (4) reclassify Everett Baumgarner to the position of Building/Airport Lead Person at a rate of \$24.0083 per hour effective September 1, 2015.

Transfer Jacqueline Heinrich from the position of Community Assistance Officer to the position of Administrative Assistant - Police Department.

Background Information:

With the recent resignation of Melissa Skoglund from the position of Administrative Assistant in the Police Department, there is a vacancy that needs to be filled. Jacqueline Heinrich was hired as a Dispatcher in June 2008. In January 2009 she became the Community Assistance Officer, the position she currently holds. Jackie has worked extensively in the office as a back up to the Administrative Assistants and while on light duty. She is very familiar with the policies and procedures as well as the use of the equipment.

City Administrator Tom Pagel, Chief of Police Scott Johnson, Assistant Chief of Police Steve Schaar, and Human Resources Director Lynn DeGrio met with union representation and discussed the possibility of a lateral transfer for Jackie from the Community Assistance Officer to the Administrative Assistant - Police Department position. It was verbally agreed that we can waive the 5 day internal posting requirement to expedite the process since there aren't any clerical union employees interested in the position, with the exception of Jackie.

We would like to change the job title of the Community Assistance Officer to Community Service Officer (CSO), which is standard language in law enforcement. We would also like to amend the job description to reflect the necessary duties of the position. A draft is attached for your review. Once the position is posted, advertised, and interviews have been completed, we will come back to you with a recommendation for filling the vacancy.

Staff Recommendation:

We are recommending transferring Jacqueline Heinrich from the Community Assistance Officer position to the the Administrative Assistant - Police Department position effective September 15, 2015. We are also recommending changing the job title from Community Assistance Officer to Community Service Officer (CSO).

Requested City Council Action

Consider authorizing the transfer of Jacqueline Heinrich from the position of Community Assistance Officer to the position of Administrative Assistant - Police Department effective September 15, 2015 and authorize City staff to begin the process of filling the vacancy of Community Service Officer.

Summary: This position involves public contact, performing a variety of routine, non-critical, public safety tasks that do not require the attention of a licensed peace officer. These include but are not limited to: domestic animal control; Domestic Animal Control Facility maintenance and record keeping, responding to citizen requests for service; community policing activities, crime prevention, traffic control, transporting of vehicles, property and evidence, answering citizen inquiries, animal quarantine follow-up, assisting motorists, municipal parking enforcement and other duties.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities include the following. The duties listed are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work that may be performed. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related or a logical assignment to that position. Other duties may be assigned.

- Patrols, investigates and enforces violations of the animal control ordinances.
- Maintains animal records including licensing and rabies vaccinations.
- Maintenance of the City of Grand Rapids Domestic Animal Control Facility, including daily cleaning of the facility and snow shoveling.
- Feeds and cares for animals in the Facility.

- Responds to calls of animal bites, documenting circumstances, tracking Potentially Dangerous and Dangerous Dogs.
- Conducting 10-day animal bite quarantine follow-up, documenting findings and notifying victims.
- Enforces parking laws, educates citizens about parking laws in an effort to reduce parking violations.
- Inputs data into department forms and compiles reports as requested.
- Provides service to the citizens including sharing information, assisting with funeral escorts, traffic direction, helping motorists and special event activity.

The Community Service Officer is expected to abide by the appropriate state law, city policy, department policy and use good judgement.

Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job, employee
