CALL TO ORDER: Pursuant to due notice and call thereof a regular meeting of the Grand Rapids Human Rights Commission was held in Conference Room 2B of City Hall, Grand Rapids, Minnesota, on Wednesday, August 27, 2014 at 4:00 p.m.

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m.

<u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u>: June 25, 2014 meeting, there was no July meeting.

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER SANDERSON, SECOND BY OMMISSIONER LAPLANT TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF JUNE 25, 2014 AS PRESENTED. Motion passed unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

<u>Circle of Healing:</u> Commissioner LaPlant gave a report on Why Treaties Matter. The exhibit will go to ICC from September 3-26. George Gogeleye will be present to help with any questions on September 26 during the educator workshop. A tour schedule is in the works as to the different locations the exhibit will travel from now until June 2016. The Circle of Healing is hosting a booth at the Chamber Networking Event on October 8th at the Timberlake. Commissioners are welcome to attend.

<u>Tracks in the Snow</u>: Tracks in the Snow: Following up on previous Commission discussions, but due to meeting schedules and interim notification that an expression of interest was needed by the group that produced the Tracks in the Snow exhibit due to a grant application funding deadline, Commissioner Learmont reported that he had sent a non-binding letter on his own behalf, clearly stating that it was not a Commission letter, to notify the producing group that the public record showed there was interest in bringing the exhibit to Grand Rapids and that the Commission would be updated at its next meeting and could send a letter of support if it wished to do so. Commissioner Learmont indicated willingness to develop the letter of support at the pleasure of the Commission.

Importance of Language – Commissioner Sanderson reported on the people first language. People First Language puts the person before the disability, and it describes what a person has, not who a person is. A document will be scanned to staff for their information.

Save a Walleye (t-shirt) – Commissioner Sanderson would like it if someone from the Commission would check into if this is legal or not. Commissioner Dowell will talk to the Police Chief & report back.

Goals – Commissioner Sanderson put together a packet of documents from 2004 to the present. Information regarding the Commission's priorities, training, partnerships, goals.

• Each Commission Member was asked to come back to the next Human Rights Commission Meeting in September with 1 or 2 ideas they think the Commission should work on in the upcoming months.

<u>Indigenous People's Day Proclamation</u> – Commissioners Hall, Noyce, Freeman and LaPlant will draft an Indigenous People's Day proclamation for the Commissions review. Michele will provide an example for their use.

The Human Rights Commission of the City of Grand Rapids, Minnesota, is aware of the Tracks in the Snow exhibit. We understand that the Islamic Resource Group (IRG) was responsible for producing this exhibit, we understand that IRG is interested in displaying and presenting this exhibit in Minnesota outside of the Twin Cities metropolitan area, and we understand that you are applying for an Art Tour Grant from the Minnesota State Arts Board to fund travel and display of the exhibit in outstate or greater Minnesota.

The Grand Rapids Human Rights Commission believes that the Tracks in the Snow exhibit is consistent with the purpose of the Commission. Shared sponsorship of the exhibit in Grand Rapids had been discussed conceptually at previous Commission meetings, and at its August 27, 2014 meeting, following discussion, the Commission voted to support bringing the Tracks in the Snow Exhibit to Grand Rapids in the 2015-2016 time period and requested that I, as a Commission member, notify you of the Commission's interest and support. The Commission has several ideas on appropriate venues, other local collaborating supporters, and opportunities for associated events and activities. Final confirmations from the Commission would still be needed pending discussion and agreement on specific dates, locations, activities, and funding. Major funding from the Minnesota State Arts Board grant would be very helpful and appreciated for this to happen.

Being interested in hosting the Tracks in the Snow exhibit in this outstate location, the Grand Rapids Human Rights Commission would appreciate your keeping us informed of the progress of the grant application and approval, as well as other related developments as exhibition planning moves forward.
