CITY OF GRAND RAPIDS HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION SPECIAL MEETING CITY HALL LUNCH ROOM – 420 NORTH POKEGAMA AVENUE WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 10, 2010 – 4:00 P.M.

CALL TO ORDER: Pursuant to due notice and call thereof a special meeting of the Grand Rapids Human Rights Commission was held in the Lunch Room of City Hall, 420 North Pokegama Avenue, Grand Rapids, Minnesota, on Wednesday, November 10, 2010, at 4:00 p.m.

CALL OF ROLL: On a Call of Roll, the following members were present: Commission Vice Chair Wartchow, Commissioners: Freeman, Hall, Learmont, Mundt (arrived at 4:03 p.m.) and Sanderson. Absent: Downing and Hall

Staff: Lynn DeGrio, Human Resources Director

The meeting was called to order by Commission Vice Chair Wartchow at 4:00 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

August 25, 2010 Regular Meeting

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER SANDERSON, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER FREEMAN TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF AUGUST 25, 2010 REGULAR MEETING AS PRESENTED. The following voted in favor thereof: Sanderson, Freeman, Hall, Learmont, and Wartchow. Opposed: None, motion carried.

2. Future Meeting Dates and Times – Propose Changing By-Laws.

Commission members discussed changing the 2011 meeting dates to monthly rather than quarterly to make scheduling easier. After discussion, the following motion was made:

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER HALL, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER LEARMONT TO REQUEST THE CITY COUNCIL CHANGE THE HUMAN RIGHTS BY-LAWS TO MEETING MONTHLY RATHER THAN QUARTERLY ON THE LAST WEDNESDAY OF THE MONTH AT 4:00 P.M. STARTING JANUARY, 2011. The following voted in favor thereof: Hall, Learmont, Freeman, Mundt, Sanderson and Wartchow. Opposed: None, motion carried.

3. Budget Update.

The 2010 Budget was originally \$2,000; there is now \$916.23 available. The Human Rights Conference is budgeted at \$200 each which will be refunded in a form of a grant.

The 2011 Budget is now under consideration by the City Council. At the November 24, 2010 regular meeting, the Commission needs to determine how to spend the remaining 2010 money.

4. Request to Co-Sponsor Symposium 11-17-2010 – Jewish Holocaust.

Commissioner Sanderson stated the Human Rights Commission has been a sponsor for many years. After a brief report the following motion was made:

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER SANDERSON, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER MUNDT FOR THE GRAND RAPIDS HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION TO ALLOCATE \$250 FOR THE ICC SYMPOSIUM. The following voted in favor thereof: Sanderson, Mundt, Hall, Freeman, Learmont and Wartchow. Opposed: None, motion carried.

Human Resources Director Lynn DeGrio will notify all employees and an Itasca County staff member of the event.

5. 27th Annual Human Rights Day Conference & Forum 12-3-2010.

Commissioners Sanderson and Wartchow plan to attend. Commissioner Hall will be in Cuba.

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER **FREEMAN** SECOND BY COMMISSIONER **PAY** FOR **COMMISSIONERS** MUNDT TO SANDERSON AND WARTCHOW TO ATTEND THE 27TH ANNUAL HUMAN RIGHTS DAY CONFERENCE & FORUM ON 12-3-2010. The following voted in favor thereof: Freeman, Mundt, Hall, Learmont, Sanderson and Wartchow. Opposed: None, motion carried.

6. New Human Rights Commission Chairperson Appointment.

Discussion ensued in regard to the appointment of a new Chairperson. It was determined Commissioner Sanderson would contact Sue Lehto to see what her wishes are. Commission Vice Chair Wartchow stated he is willing to fill in for Sue Lehto until school is out if she wishes to return. Information will be brought back to the next Human Rights Commission meeting.

7. Contact/Distribution List to be Created.

The Commissioners would like to compose a list of email and mailing address to send notices of special Human Rights events using their budget dollars. Those who should be included on this distribution list include but are not limited to: ICC, County, City employees, and Chamber. The Commissioners would like:

> each member to bring a list of names and address for contact to the next meeting

- > discuss at the next meeting
- > create a process on how to contact

8. League of Human Rights Nomination for District 1.

This is a nonprofit organization at the State level. Commissioner Sanderson served for approximately six years in the past. This position would be a part of planning the Annual Human Rights Conference and would be required to attend meetings representing District 1. Commission Vice Chair Wartchow asked if anyone was interested; there were no nominations.

9. Handicap Accessibility Improvement Program.

Community Development Director, Rob Mattei recommended waiting until late winter to send the ADA compliance letter out. Commissioner Sanderson drafted the letter for the mass mailing in regard to the ADA compliance. The Blandin Foundation has asked for a final report due on January 11, 2011. Vice-Chair Wartchow will contact Mary Kosak, Program Officer at Blandin Foundation to ask for an extension.

10. Rapids Read Discussion.

The Human Rights Commission is a supporter/co-sponsor of the 2011 Rapids Read. Through a \$1500 grant from the State Department of Human Rights, the Commission will pay \$1,000 toward the guest speaker Kao Kalia Yang expenses, author of "The Latehomecomer" and \$500 for additional copies of the book for the public. The community event will be held mid-February through mid-March. In addition, the Human Rights Commission has been asked to host a community discussion on the book with the main emphasis on human rights issues. Commissioner Freeman will contact staff at Itasca Community College to set up a date and time to work with both students and staff.

11. Blandin Foundation Grant Final Report.

The Blandin Foundation is requesting a final report for the grant. Vice Chair Wartchow will call Mary Kosak at the Blandin Foundation to see if the Human Rights Commission may have an extension and ask if they need the request in writing. Human Resources Director DeGrio will mention a possible extension to Finance Director Miller and Assistant Finance Director Baird.

The next regularly scheduled meeting will be November 24, 2010 at 3:30 p.m. unless otherwise noted. Commission Vice Chair Wartchow and Commissioner Learmont will not be available November 24, 2010.

Vice Chair Wartchow would like to add to the next agenda, the Blandin Foundation grant request to assist the Community Read 2011 program to discuss how to come up with a plan to support new people in our community after the program is over.

ADJOURN:

There being no further business the following motion was made to adjourn the meeting:

MOTION BY COMMISSIONER LEARMONT, SECOND BY COMMISSIONER SANDERSON TO ADJOURN THE MEETING AT 4:48 P.M. The following voted in favor thereof: Learmont, Sanderson, Wartchow, Freeman, Hall and Mundt. Opposed: None, motion carried.


